# Prohibition of Traffic (Lancaster Street, Belfast) Order (Northern Ireland) 1983

Made28th November 1983Coming into operation16th January 1984

The Department of the Environment in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 22(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf and being satisfied that the road specified in Article 2 is unsuitable for use by vehicles, hereby makes the following Order:—

### Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Prohibition of Traffic (Lancaster Street, Belfast) Order (Northern Ireland) 1983 and shall come into operation on 16th January 1984.

#### Prohibition

2. Subject to Article 3, the use by vehicles of Lancaster Street, Belfast, is prohibited.

# Exemptions

3. The prohibition in Article 2 shall not apply to vehicles being used for access by the owners or occupiers of premises abutting on the said road or by visitors to such premises or for the delivery or collection from such premises of goods of any kind, or in connection with public utility or emergency services.

# **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This note is not part of the Order.)

This Order prohibits vehicles from using Lancaster Street, Belfast.

Provision is made to exempt vehicles requiring access.

Any person who acts in contravention of the Order shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £100.

Traffic signs indicating the effect of the Order will, in due course, be erected on the road.
