ACCESS TO THE COUNTRYSIDE

Access to the Countryside Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1984

The Department of the Environment in exercise of the powers conferred by Articles 12(3), 14(3), 15(6), 29(4) and 41(1) of, and paragraphs 1(1), 3 and 4 of Schedule 1 to, the Access to the Countryside (Northern Ireland) Order 1983(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:

Citation and commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Access to the Countryside Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1984 and shall come into operation on 2nd November 1984.

Interpretation

- 2.—(1) In these regulations the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them respectively, that is to say—
 - "the Order", means the Access to the Countryside (Northern Ireland) Order 1983:
 - "a public path order" means a public path creation order, a public path extinguishment order or a public path diversion order, and includes an order revoking or varying any such order.

Form of public path orders

- 3.—(1) A public path order shall be in the appropriate form set out in Schedule 1 with such modifications as the circumstances may require.
- (2) The map required to be annexed to a public path order shall define the land over which the right-of-way is thereby created, extinguished or diverted, and shall be on a scale of not less than 1:2,500 provided that the Department may in any particular case authorise a smaller scale.
- (3) In the case of any conflict between the map and the particulars contained in the schedule to the public path order, the schedule shall prevail.

Form of access order

4. An access order shall be in the form set out in Schedule 2 with such modifications as the circumstances may require.

Maps

- 5.—(1) This regulation shall apply to the following maps:—
- (a) any map required to be annexed to an access order (hereinafter referred to as an "access order map");
- (b) any map required to be prepared under Article 41 (hereinafter referred to as a "rights of public access map").

- (2) Any maps to which this regulation applies shall be ordnance maps, on a scale not less than 1:10,000 or 1:10,560 where 1:10,000 is not available.
- (3) Every access order map shall define the land comprised in the order by means of a green edging, and in addition, so far as it appears practicable to the district council making the order, shall identify—
 - (a) any land so comprised, which is subject to restrictions on access by virtue of the order, by means of green edging and green dots overall;
 - (b) any land so comprised, which at the time when the order is made is excepted land, by means of green vertical hatching edged green.
 - (4) (a) Every rights of public access map shall identify land of any of the descriptions specified in Column 1 of the following table by means of the symbol specified opposite that description in Column 2 of the said table (enclosing an identification number if appropriate) on the said map:—

- (b) Every rights of public access map shall, in addition, define—
 - (i) any land comprised in an access agreement or order, which is subject to restrictions on access by virtue of the agreement or order, by means of a green edging and green dots overall;
- (ii) any land so comprised, which is for the time being excepted land, by means of green vertical hatching edged green;
- (iii) any land comprised in land acquired and held under Article 39 or 40 from which, for the purpose of avoiding danger to the public or to persons employed thereon or for any other reason, the public are excluded, by means of green cross hatching edged green.
- (5) Inset maps on a larger scale than the minimum specified in paragraph (2) may be included in any map to which this regulation applies for the purpose of more particularly defining any part of any land and in the case of conflict between the map and the inset map the latter shall prevail.

Procedure for making of orders

- **6.**—(1) An order submitted to the Department for confirmation shall be accompanied by:—
 - (a) two copies of the order;
 - (b) a statement by the district council by whom the order was made of the grounds on which it considers that the order should be confirmed;
 - (c) a certificate that the notice of the making of the order has been given before submission as required by Schedule 1 to the Order (giving the date of posting or service) together with a copy of any notice given and a cutting of the advertisement as it appeared in the local newspaper;
 - (d) in any case in which the Order requires the council to obtain the consent of, or to consult with, any other council or body before the order is made, a certificate that such consent has been obtained or such consultation has taken place, together with particulars of the consultations carried out and copies of any comments received;

- (e) a copy of all representations and objections to the order not withdrawn (together with the comments thereon of the council);
- (f) an undertaking that should the order be confirmed any new path to be provided will be ready for use before the order comes into operation.
- (2) After an order has been confirmed by the Department or confirmed by the district council as an unopposed order, the district council shall as soon as the requirements of paragraph 4 of Schedule 1 to the Order have been complied with, supply the Department with a certificate to that effect.
- (3) Any notice required to be given, published, served, affixed or displayed under Schedule 1 to the Order by a district council by whom an order is made shall be in the appropriate form of forms 1, 2, 3 and 4 set out in Schedule 3 with such modifications as the circumstances may require.
- (4) Where the Department makes a public path extinguishment or diversion order any notice in relation to the order which the Department is required to publish, serve or display under paragraph 4 of Schedule 1 to the Order shall be in the form of form 3 set out in Schedule 3 with such modifications as the circumstances may require.
- (5) Any notice or other document to be served on an owner, occupier or lessee in accordance with paragraph 1(3), 1(4), 2(3) or 4 of Schedule 1 to the Order shall at the beginning have clearly and legibly inscribed upon it the words:

IMPORTANT — THIS COMMUNICATION AFFECTS YOUR PROPERTY

and where the notice or document is sent under cover otherwise than in a prepaid registered letter, or by the recorded delivery service, the cover shall in addition be endorsed in like manner.

- (6) The notice required to be given under paragraphs 1(1) and 2(2) and 4(1)(a) of Schedule 1 to the Order shall be served on the bodies specified in Schedule 4.
- (7) In this regulation the expression "order" means a public path order or an access order and includes any order varying or revoking any such order.

- [2. Notwithstanding anything contained in this order (name of statutory undertaker) shall have the following rights over the land referred to in paragraph 1, namely:—

Access to the Countryside (Northern Ireland) Order 1983

Whereas Part III of the Access to the Countryside (Northern Ireland) Order 1983, (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") makes provision for enabling the public to have access for open air recreation to open country to which the provisions of Article 26 of the Order are applied by an access order made under the said Part III;

- (1) The provisions of Article 26 of the Order shall apply to the land, the boundaries of which are described in Schedule 1 and delineated by the outer edge of the green line on the map[s] annexed to this order and the land so bounded is hereafter referred to as "the land comprised in the order"; provided that the land delineated by the outer edge of a green line and hatched by green vertical hatching on the said map[s] is excepted land as defined in Article 26(5) of and Schedule 3 to the Order.
 - (2) (i) The rights conferred on the public by virtue of this order shall, as respects the areas delineated by the outer edge of a green line and dotted green on the map[s] annexed to this order, be subject to the restrictions specified in Schedule 2 during such periods as are specified in the said Schedule.
 - (ii) The Council may, by resolution, impose such further restrictions as may be specified in the resolution and shall take such steps as they may consider necessary by advertisement or notice boards or otherwise to give the public notice of such restrictions provided that:—
 - (a) such restrictions shall not in any event be operated for more than 2 years from the date of the resolution;
 - (b) the Department of the Environment for Northern Ireland may by notice in writing to the Council direct that such further restrictions shall be imposed during such periods as may be specified in the direction, and any such restrictions shall be deemed to have been imposed by resolution by the Council passed at the date of the Department's direction;
 - (c) the said Department may, either generally or in any particular case, by notice as aforesaid give directions as to the manner in which notice of any restrictions shall be given to the public.
- (3) The provisions set out in Schedule 3 shall apply in pursuance of Article 32 of the Order for providing sufficient means of access to the land comprised in the order.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations.)

These regulations provide for various procedural matters which are required to be prescribed by the Access to the Countryside (Northern Ireland) Order 1983.

Regulation 3 provides for the form of orders required under Part II of the Order to provide for the creation, extinguishment and diversion of public paths.

Regulation 4 provides for the form of order required under Part III of the Order to provide for public access to open country.

Regulation 5 describes the form of map to be attached to an order providing for public access to open country and the form of map which a district council is required to keep and make available to the public indicating land which gives access or forms part of access to open country.

Regulation 6 deals with the procedure to be followed in connection with the making and confirmation of access orders and public path orders and the prescription of certain bodies to be served with notice of the making and confirmation of orders.
