Royal Ulster Constabulary (Amendment) Regulations 1985

Made 12th May 1985 Coming into operation 1st July 1985

To be laid before Parliament

The Secretary of State, in pursuance of section 25 of the Police Act (Northern Ireland) 1970(a), read with section 18 of the Administrative and Financial Provisions Act (Northern Ireland) 1962(b), and after consulting, in accordance with section 34(2) of the said Act of 1970, the Police Authority for Northern Ireland and the Police Association for Northern Ireland, and after taking into account the recommendations made by the Police Negotiating Board for the United Kingdom and furnishing that Board with a draft of the regulations in accordance with section 2(1) of the Police Negotiating Board Act 1980(c), hereby with the concurrence of the Treasury makes the following regulations:—

Citation, operation and effect

- 1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Royal Ulster Constabulary (Amendment) Regulations 1985.
- (2) These regulations shall come into operation on 1st July 1985 but shall have effect for the purposes of regulation 3 as from 1st September 1984.

Interpretation

2. In these regulations any reference to the principal regulations is a reference to the Royal Ulster Constabulary Regulations 1984(d).

Pay

3. In Schedule 5 to the principal regulations for Table A there shall be substituted the following Table:—

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations.)

These regulations amend the Royal Ulster Constabulary Regulations 1984 (the principal regulations).
