## ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES

## Disabled Persons Parking Bye-Laws (Northern Ireland) 1985

Made . . . . . 9th December 1985

Coming into operation . . . . . 15th January 1986

The Department of the Environment in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 105(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf makes the following bye-laws:—

*Citation and commencement*

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Disabled Persons Parking Bye-Laws (Northern Ireland) 1985 and shall come into operation on 15th January 1986.

*Use of parking spaces*

2. Where signs are erected or surface markings are laid indicating that space has been reserved on a road for the purpose of accommodating a disabled person's vehicle, the driver of a vehicle other than a disabled person's vehicle shall not permit it to wait in the space so prescribed.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not part of the Bye-Laws.)*

These bye-laws prohibit the use of a parking space reserved on a road for disabled persons' vehicles by any other vehicle.

Any person who contravenes the bye-laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £100.
