The Matrimonial Causes Fees (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1986

Made 14th July 1986

Coming into operation 31st July 1986

The Lord Chancellor, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 116(1) of the Judicature (Northern Ireland) Act 1978(a) and sections 2 and 3 of the Public Offices Fees Act 1879(b), after consultation with the Lord Chief Justice and with the concurrence of the Treasury, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Matrimonial Causes Fees (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1986 and shall come into operation on 31st July 1986.

2. In the Schedule to the Matrimonial Causes Fees Order (Northern Ireland) 1981(c) for the figure £50·00 in Column 2 at item 2(a) shall be substituted the figure £55·00.

**Medicines (Exemptions) from Licences and Animal Test Certificates)
Order 1986**

This Order has been made by the Secretary of State concerned with health in England, the Secretaries of State respectively concerned with health and with agriculture in Scotland and in Wales, the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, the Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland, and the Department of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, acting jointly, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 15(1)(2) and 35(8)(b)(9) of the Medicines Act 1968.
