# Rainbow Trout Waters Byelaws (Northern Ireland) 1987

The Fisheries Conservancy Board for Northern Ireland, in exercise of their powers under Section 26(1) of the Fisheries Act (Northern Ireland) 1966(a) and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, with the approval of the Department of Agriculture hereby make the following Byelaws:

#### Citation and commencement

1. These Byelaws may be cited as the Rainbow Trout Waters Byelaws (Northern Ireland) 1987 and shall come into operation on 2nd March 1987.

# Designation of rainbow trout waters

2. The following waters are hereby designated as rainbow trout waters for the purposes of Bye-law 51 of the Fisheries Consolidated, Amendment and Licence Duties Bye-laws (Northern Ireland) 1969(b) (which stipulates that there shall be no close season for angling for rainbow trout in waters so designated):

Kilgad Lake, Co. Antrim.

Lower Quolie Reservoir, Co. Antrim.

Mossley Mill Pond, Co. Antrim.

North Woodburn Reservoir, Co. Antrim.

Straid Lake, Co. Antrim.

Craigavon Lakes, Co. Armagh.

Darkley Lake, Co. Armagh.

Ballymacashon Lough, Co. Down.

Ballymartin Lough, Co. Down.

Kernan Lake, Co. Down.

Pepper's Lake, Co. Down.

Tonaghmore Reservoir, Co. Down.

Trench Farm Pond, Co. Down.

Warrenpoint Waterworks Reservoir, Co. Down.

Henderson's Lake, Co. Londonderry.

Holybank Bleachworks Dam, Belfast.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Byelaws.)

These Byelaws designate a number of waters as rainbow trout waters for the purposes of Bye-law 51 of the Fisheries Consolidated, Amendment and Licence Duties Bye-laws (Northern Ireland) 1969 which provides that there shall be no close season for angling for rainbow trout in waters so designated. These Byelaws differ from the previous Byelaws in that Kilgad Lake and Straid Lake both in Co. Antrim have been designated as rainbow trout waters.
