The Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 17(1)(a) of the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Act 1975(a) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Social Security (Unemployment, Sickness and Invalidity Benefit) (Amendment No. 2) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1987 and shall come into operation on 11th May 1987.

(2) In these regulations "the principal regulations" means the Social Security (Unemployment, Sickness and Invalidity Benefit) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1984(**b**).

Amendment of the principal regulations

2. In regulation 3(3) of the principal regulations (earnings limit for persons deemed incapable of work) for "ordinarily exceed £26.00 a week" there shall be substituted "exceed £26.00 in the week in which that work is performed".

Social Security EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations.)

These regulations amend regulation 3(3) of the Social Security (Unemployment, Sickness and Invalidity Benefit) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1984 so that where a person undertakes work under medical supervision as part of his treatment while he is a patient in or of a hospital or similar institution or does work which is not so undertaken and which he has good cause for doing he may be treated as incapable of work provided his earnings in the week in which that work is performed do not exceed the sum specified in the regulation, at present $\pounds 26.00$.

The regulations correspond to provision contained in regulations made by the Secretary of State for Social Services in relation to Great Britain and accordingly, by virtue of section 10(2) of, and paragraph 21 of Schedule 3 to, the Social Security Act 1980 (c. 30) are not subject to the requirement of section 10(1) of that Act for prior reference to the Social Security Advisory Committee.

Medicines (Products Other Than Veterinary Drugs) (Prescription Only) Amendment Order 1987

This Order has been made by the Secretary of State concerned with health in England, the Secretaries of State respectively concerned with health and with agriculture in Scotland and in Wales, the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, the Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland, and the Department of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, acting jointly, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 58(1)(4)(5) and 129(4) of the Medicines Act 1968.

In pursuance of paragraph 11 of Schedule 4 to that Act this Order has been registered as a Northern Ireland statutory rule under the Statutory Rules (Northern Ireland) Order 1979. It is printed in full in the volume of United Kingdom Statutory Instruments for 1987 and has been numbered 674 in that series.
