## The Social Security (1988 Order) (Commencement No. 1) Order (Northern Ireland) 1988

The Department of Health and Social Services, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 1(3) of the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Order 1988(a), paragraph 2(1) of Schedule 1 to the Northern Ireland Act 1974(b) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:

## Citation and interpretation

- 1.—(1) This order may be cited as the Social Security (1988 Order) (Commencement No. 1) Order (Northern Ireland) 1988.
- (2) In this order "the Order" means the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Order 1988.

## Appointed days

- 2. The day appointed for the coming into operation of—
- (a) the provisions of the Order specified in Part I of the Schedule is 6th April 1988;
- (b) the provisions of the Order specified in Part II of the Schedule is 11th April 1988;
- (c) Article 7 of the Order (contribution conditions for short-term benefits) and Article 16(2) of the Order so far as it relates to the repeals in Schedule 5 to the Order of provisions in Schedule 3 to the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Act 1975(c) is 2nd October 1988; and
- (d) Article 8 of the Order (unemployment benefit and occupational pension) is 1st January 1989.

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

## (This note is not part of the Order.)

This order provides for the coming into operation of provisions of the Social Security (Northern Ireland) Order 1988 on the following dates:

- 6th April 1988 for the provisions in:-
  - Article 10 and Schedule 2 relating to earnings factors and transfer values,
  - Article 13 (1) to (7) relating to welfare foods,
  - Schedules 4 and 5 relating to statutory maternity pay;
- 11th April 1988 for the provisions in:—
  - Article 4(3) to (9) and Schedule 1 relating to industrial injuries benefit,
  - Article 5 relating to family credit,
  - Article 12 and Schedule 3 relating to the social fund,
  - Article 13(8) relating to welfare foods,
  - Article 14 relating to the Health Service payment of travelling expenses, etc., and remission of charges,
  - Schedules 4 and 5 relating to welfare foods, maternity allowance, industrial injuries benefit, income support, family credit and the social fund;
- 2nd October 1988 for the provisions in Article 7 and Schedule 5 relating to contribution conditions for short-term benefits;
- 1st January 1989 for the provision in Article 8 which relates to unemployment benefit and occupational pension.
