ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES

Control of Traffic (Newtownabbey) Order
(Northern Ireland) 1989

Made 22nd May 1989

Coming into operation 9th July 1989

WHEREAS the Department of the Environment has published a notice in compliance with Article 23(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a);

AND WHEREAS no objection has been received;

NOW THEREFORE the Department in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 21(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf makes the following Order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Control of Traffic (Newtownabbey) Order (Northern Ireland) 1989 and shall come into operation on 9th July 1989.

Prohibition

2. A person shall not except upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform or of a traffic warden:—

- (a) cause or permit any vehicle to enter the Ballyclare Road, Route B56 from the service road adjacent to Glengormley High School at its southern point of access;
- (b) cause or permit any vehicle to enter the service road adjacent to Glengormley High School at its northern point of access from the Ballyclare Road, Route B56.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order.)

This Order prohibits vehicles from entering the Ballyclare Road, Route B56 from the service road adjacent to Glengormley High School at the southern point of access and from entering the service road from Ballyclare Road at its northern point of access.

Any person who acts in contravention of the Order shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale (£400).

Traffic signs indicating the effect of the Order will in due course be erected on the road.
