

1989 No. 92**ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES****One-Way Traffic (Ballycastle) Order
(Northern Ireland) 1989**

Made 16th March 1989

Coming into operation 7th May 1989

WHEREAS the Department of the Environment has published a notice in compliance with Article 23(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a);

AND WHEREAS no objection has been received;

NOW THEREFORE the Department in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 21(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf makes the following Order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the One-Way Traffic (Ballycastle) Order (Northern Ireland) 1989 and shall come into operation on 7th May 1989.

Prohibition

2. A person shall not, except upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to proceed on Clare Street, Ballycastle, from its junction with Market Street to its junction with Castle Street, other than in a southerly direction from Market Street.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order.)

This Order provides for the introduction of a one-way system of traffic in Clare Street, Ballycastle.

Any person who acts in contravention of the Order shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale (£400).

Traffic signs indicating the effect of the Order will in due course be erected on the road.
