Pharmaceutical Society of Northern Ireland (General) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1990

The Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 5 of the Pharmacy (Northern Ireland) Order 1976(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, with the approval of the Department of Health and Social Services, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Pharmaceutical Society of Northern Ireland (General) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1990 and shall come into operation on 1st June 1990.

(2) In these Regulations—

"the Order" means the Pharmacy (Northern Ireland) Order 1976;

"the Secretary" means the Secretary of the Society.

Fees

2. The fees payable for registration under Article 8 of the Order as a pharmaceutical chemist shall be $\pounds 50.00$ and for registration as a student $\pounds 5.00$.

3. The fee payable under Article 20(2) of the Order for restoration of a person's name to the register shall be ± 30.00 .

4.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), the retention fee payable in respect of each year under Article 15(1) of the Order shall be—

(a) in respect of a member of the Society, $\pounds 70.00$;

(b) in respect of an associate of the Society, ± 5.00 ;

(c) in respect of a student of the Society, ± 5.00 .

(2) Notwithstanding paragraph (1)—

(a) a member of the Society who resides outside Northern Ireland and—

(i) does not own a retail pharmacy business in Northern Ireland; or

(ii) does not hold the position of superintendent of a body corporate carrying on a retail pharmacy business in Northern Ireland; or

(iii) is not employed as a pharmacist in Northern Ireland; shall pay a retention fee of $\pounds 30.00$;

- (b) a member of the Society who has attained his 65th birthday shall pay a retention fee of £30.00;
- (c) a member of the Society who has attained his 70th birthday shall pay a retention fee of ± 10.00 .

5. The penalty under Article 15(3) of the Order for default in payment of the retention fee shall be—

- (a) in respect of a person who has been a member, ± 25.00 ;
- (b) in respect of a person who has been an associate, ± 5.00 ;
- (c) in respect of a person who has been a student, ± 5.00 .

6. The fee to be paid under Article 14(2) of the Order in respect of the issue of a certificate of registration to a person who has satisfied the Secretary that the original certificate has been lost or destroyed shall be $\pounds 1.00$.

7. The demand under Article 15(3) of the Order for payment of a retention fee shall be made in writing and shall be sent by the Society to the registered address of the member, associate or student.

Qualifications for registration

8.—(1) A person who has satisfied the regulations for admission to a first degree course in pharmacy at—

- (a) a University or other institution in Northern Ireland, awarding a degree in pharmacy recognised by the Society; or
- (b) a University or other institution in Great Britain, awarding a degree in pharmacy recognised by the Royal Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain;

shall be qualified for registration as a student.

(2) Upon acceptance of a candidate for registration as a student the Council shall require him to forward to the registrar a copy of his certificate of birth.

9.—(1) A person who holds a degree in pharmacy recognised by the Society or Royal Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain and which has been awarded pursuant to a course of study at a University of the United Kingdom or at any other institution in the United Kingdom, shall, subject to the conditions set out in paragraph (2), be qualified for registration as a pharmaceutical chemist.

(2) The conditions referred to in paragraph (1) which a person is required to satisfy are that—

- (a) he has produced to the Secretary a declaration, on a form obtainable from the Secretary, containing the details set out in the Schedule;
- (b) he has produced evidence satisfactory to the Council that he has adequate knowledge of the laws governing the practice of pharmacy

and the sale of medicines and non-medicinal poisons in Northern Ireland;

(c) he has produced evidence satisfactory to the Council that he has attended a course in business management recognised by the Council.

10. Before entering upon a course of practical training a student shall notify the registrar of the date of commencement of the course, of the address of the place or places at which the course is to be undergone and of the name of the registered pharmaceutical chemist responsible for supervising the student's work.

11. A member of a pharmaceutical society of any of the following countries or states may be registered as a pharmaceutical chemist under the provisions of Article 8(4) of the Order—

- 1. Great Britain
- 2. New South Wales
- 3. New Zealand
- 4. Queensland
- 5. South Africa
- 6. South Australia
- 7. Tasmania
- 8. Victoria
- 9. Western Australia.

General

12.—(1) The Council may award annually a scholarship to a member of the Society who wishes to engage in research or further study within the range of subjects included in the syllabus for the degree in pharmacy.

(2) Each applicant must submit to the Secretary a written application giving particulars of age, education, qualifications, the particular branch of research or study in which, and the institution at which, he wishes to carry out his work together with written evidence that the institution is prepared to accept him for that purpose.

(3) Payments will be made quarterly in advance and the Council may terminate the scholarship at any time for such reasons as may appear to it to be sufficient.

Revocation

13. The Pharmaceutical Society of Northern Ireland (General) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1988(a) are hereby revoked.

Pharmacy SCHEDULE

Form of Declaration

1. The declaration required under regulation 9(2)(a) shall state that subsequent to obtaining an approved degree the applicant has satisfactorily performed, under the direct supervision of a registered pharmaceutical chemist, as his sole pupil, a course of practical training involving the application of knowledge embraced by any subject or subjects of the final examination for the degree, approved for the purpose by the Council and carried on in—

- (a) a registered pharmacy as defined in section 74 of the Medicines Act 1968(a) for a period of not less than 12 months; or
- (b) a registered pharmacy as so defined for a period of not less than 6 months, together with a period of 6 months—
 - (i) in the pharmaceutical department of a Northern Ireland hospital in which a registered pharmaceutical chemist is employed full-time; or
 - (ii) as a full-time member of the academic staff in the School of Pharmacy of the Queen's University of Belfast under the supervision of the Professor of Pharmacy; or
 - (iii) as a post-graduate student engaged in full-time research of not less than 2 years duration under the supervision of the Professor of Pharmacy at the said University; or
 - (iv) in a pharmaceutical industrial establishment in Northern Ireland approved by the Council.

2. The declaration shall state the address of the place or places at which the course was undergone, with the dates of the course at each place, and be signed by the registered pharmaceutical chemist responsible for the training or, whom failing, by some other pharmacist acceptable to the Council.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations.)

1. These Regulations re-enact with amendments the Pharmaceutical Society of Northern Ireland (General) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1988 and come into operation on 1st June 1990.

- 2. The Regulations-
- (a) prescribe the fee payable for registration as a pharmaceutical chemist or as a student and the fee payable for restoration of a person's name to the register (regulations 2 and 3);
- (b) prescribe the retention fee payable in respect of each year by a member, associate or student of the Society and the penalty for default in payment of such fee (regulations 4 and 5);
- (c) prescribe the fee payable for issue of a certificate of registration where the original certificate has been lost or destroyed (regulation 6);
- (d) prescribe the manner in which a demand shall be made for the payment of a retention fee (regulation 7);
- (e) prescribe the qualifications for registration as a student (regulation 8);
- (f) prescribe the qualifications and the practical training to be undertaken for registration as a pharmaceutical chemist (regulations 9 and 10 and Schedule);
- (g) prescribe the pharmaceutical societies outside Northern Ireland whose members may be registered as pharmaceutical chemists under the Order (regulation 11);
- (h) provide for the award by the Council of a scholarship (regulation 12).
- 3. The main changes made by the Regulations are as follows-
- (a) Fees are increased—

for registration	(i)	as a pharmaceutical chemist	from £40.00 to £50.00 (regulation 2).
for restoration			from £25.00 to £30.00 (regulation 3).
for retention	(i)	in respect of a member	from £50.00 to £70.00
	(ii)	by specified members living outside Northern Ireland	from £20.00 to £30.00
	(;;;)	hy a member who	from $f^{2}(1,0)$ to $f^{3}(1,0)$

- (iii) by a member who from $\pounds 20.00$ to $\pounds 30.00$ has attained the age (regulation 4). of 65
- (b) A new retention fee of ± 10.00 is introduced for members who have attained their 70th birthday (regulation 4(2)(c)).

(c) The limit of £100 placed on the value of a scholarship awarded by the Council has been dropped to allow the Council to vary the value to suit individual research projects (regulation 12(1)).
