

1990 No. 435**POLICE****Royal Ulster Constabulary (Amendment No. 4)
Regulations 1990**

Made 30th November 1990

Coming into operation 22nd January 1991

To be laid before Parliament

The Secretary of State, in pursuance of section 25 of the Police Act (Northern Ireland) 1970(a), read with section 18 of the Administrative and Financial Provisions Act (Northern Ireland) 1962(b), and after consulting, in accordance with section 34(2) of the said Act of 1970, the Police Authority and the Police Association, and after taking into account the recommendations made by the Police Negotiating Board for the United Kingdom and furnishing that Board with a draft of the regulations in accordance with section 2(1) of the Police Negotiating Board Act 1980(c), hereby with the concurrence of the Treasury makes the following regulations:—

Citation, operation and effect

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Royal Ulster Constabulary (Amendment No. 4) Regulations 1990.

(2) These regulations shall come into operation on 22nd January 1991 but shall have effect as on and from 1st July 1989 for the purposes of regulation 5 and as on and from 1st September 1989 for the purposes of regulations 3, 4, 6 and 7.

Interpretation

2. In these regulations any reference to the principal regulations is a reference to the Royal Ulster Constabulary Regulations 1984(d).

Overtime

3.—(1) Regulation 20 of the principal regulations shall be amended as follows:—

(a) in paragraph (1) there shall be inserted after the words “two tours of duty” the words “or which forms part of a tour of duty which he is required to begin earlier than the rostered time without due notice and on a day when he has already completed his normal period of duty”;

(b) in paragraph (7)—

- (i) there shall be inserted at the beginning of sub-paragraph (b) the words “subject to sub-paragraph (d),”;
- (ii) the word “and” at the end of sub-paragraph (b) shall be omitted, and
- (iii) there shall be added after sub-paragraph (c) the following provision—

“; and

(d) where the time at which a member is required to begin a rostered tour of duty is brought forward without due notice and so that he is required to begin that tour on a day on which he has already completed his normal daily period of duty, the time for which he is on duty before the rostered commencement time—

(i) shall be reckonable as overtime, and

(ii) shall be taken into account as part of that tour of duty,” and

(c) in paragraph 8 there shall be inserted after the definition of “a day’s pay” the following provision—

“ “due notice” means notice given at least 8 hours before the revised starting time of the rostered tour of duty in question;”.

Detective duty and detective expenses allowances

4. In regulation 47 of the principal regulations after paragraph (2) there shall be inserted the following paragraph—

“(2A) Such a member of the rank of superintendent shall be paid in addition a detective expenses allowances at the rate of £5 a week; and shall not be eligible for the reimbursement of expenses incurred in the execution of his duty in respect of any individual item of expenditure of £1.25 or less.”.

University scholars

5. Paragraph 3(2) of Schedule 4 to the principal regulations shall have effect as if from 1st July 1989 for “£1,089” there were substituted “£1,170”.

Pay

6.—(1) In Schedule 5 to the principal regulations for the Tables A, B and C there shall be substituted the Tables A, B and C set out in the Schedule.

(2) In paragraph 3(2) of Schedule 5 to the principal regulations the words “on or before 31st August 1988” shall be omitted; and

(3) Sub-paragraphs (2A) and (2B) of paragraph 3 of Schedule 5 to the principal regulations, shall be omitted.

Dog handler’s allowance

7. In Schedule 11 to the principal regulations in sub-paragraph 1(1)(a) for “£663” there shall be substituted “£723” and in sub-paragraph 1(1)(b) for “£903” there shall be substituted “£987”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations.)

These regulations amend the Royal Ulster Constabulary Regulations 1984 (the principal regulations) with effect, as provided by regulation 1, from 22nd January 1991 but for the purposes of regulation 5 shall have effect as on and from 1st July 1989 and, for the purposes of regulations 3, 4, 6 and 7 shall have effect as on and from 1st September 1989. Retrospection is authorised by section 18 of the Administrative and Financial Provisions Act (Northern Ireland) 1962.

Regulation 3 provides for the payment of overtime in specified circumstances where the beginning of an officer's tour of duty is brought forward.

Regulation 4 makes provision for a detective expenses allowance for officers of the rank of superintendent and excludes entitlement to reimbursement of expenses in respect of any individual item of expenditure not exceeding £1·25.

Regulation 5 increases the supplementary pay allowance for university scholars.

Regulation 6 increases the rates of pay for members of the force.

Regulation 7 increases the dog handler's allowance.
