ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES

Control of Traffic (Lisburn) Order (Northern Ireland) 1991

Made 22nd July 1991

Coming into operation 8th September 1991

WHEREAS the Department of the Environment has published a notice in compliance with Article 23(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a);

AND WHEREAS no objection has been received;

NOW THEREFORE the Department in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Articles 2(2)(b) and 21(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf makes the following Order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Control of Traffic (Lisburn) Order (Northern Ireland) 1991 and shall come into operation on 8th September 1991.

Prohibition of right-hand turn

2. Subject to Article 3 a person shall not cause or permit a vehicle travelling in a westerly direction along Laganbank Road, Lisburn, to make a right-hand turn into Hillsborough Road.

Exemptions

3. Article 2 shall not apply to—

- (a) vehicles being used in an emergency by a medical practitioner or for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes; or
- (b) a vehicle, the driver of which is acting upon the direction or with the permission of a constable in uniform or of a traffic warden.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order.)

This Order prohibits vehicles travelling in a westerly direction along Laganbank Road, Lisburn, from making a right-hand turn into Hillsborough Road.

Any person who acts in contravention of the Order shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale (£400).

Traffic signs indicating the effect of the Order will in due course be erected on the road.
