Fisheries Consolidated and Amendment (Temporary Amendment) Byelaws (Northern Ireland) 1991

Made 9th August 1991

Coming into operation 1st September 1991

The Fisheries Conservancy Board for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers conferred on it under section 26(1) and 37 of the Fisheries Act (Northern Ireland) 1966(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, with the approval of the Department of Agriculture, hereby makes the following Byelaws:

Citation and commencement

1. These Byelaws may be cited as the Fisheries Consolidated and Amendment (Temporary Amendment) Byelaws (Northern Ireland) 1991 and shall come into operation on 1st September 1991.

Amendment

2. In Schedule 2 of the Fisheries Consolidated and Amendment Byelaws (Northern Ireland) 1989(b) the following entry shall be added to the list of Rivers in Co. Fermanagh:

“(d) The River Erne from the mouth of the river immediately west of Marker Buoy 58A in Lough Erne to a point 750 metres downstream of the Rosscor Viaduct”.

Duration and expiry

3. These Byelaws shall have effect from 31st August 1991 to 30th November 1991 and from 14th June 1992 to 6th September 1992.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Byelaws.)

These Byelaws amend the Fisheries Consolidated and Amendment Byelaws (Northern Ireland) 1989 in order to add that part of the River Erne which lies between the point where Lower Lough Erne discharges into the River and a point 750 metres downstream of Rossvor Viaduct to the list of waters on which a coarse fishing rod licence is valid from 1st September 1991 to 30th November 1991 inclusive and from 15th June 1992 to 6th September 1992 inclusive.
