ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES

The (Pelican) Pedestrian Crossings (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1992

Made 16th March 1992

Coming into operation 29th April 1992

The Department of the Environment, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Articles 2(2) and 27 of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, makes the following Regulations:

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the (Pelican) Pedestrian Crossings (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1992 and shall come into operation on 29th April 1992.

Amendment

2. For paragraph 5 of Schedule 2 to the (Pelican) Pedestrian Crossings Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1989(b) substitute the following paragraph—

“5. Subject to paragraph 10 the presence and limits of a controlled area shall be indicated by the outside edge of the nearer row of studs indicating the limits of the crossing and by the pattern of lines placed in the positions shown, and in accordance with the measurements specified, in the diagram corresponding to the type of crossing and in accordance with paragraphs 6, 7, 8 and 9 and the controlled area shall extend along the carriageway from the said studs to the terminal lines shown in the diagram.”.
