**Motor Vehicles (Driving Licences) (Amendment No. 2)
Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1993**

Made 24th June 1993

Coming into operation 2nd August 1993

The Department of the Environment, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Articles 5(1)(f), 19C, and 218(1) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981(a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, makes the following Regulations:

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Motor Vehicles (Driving Licences) (Amendment No. 2) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1993 and shall come into operation on 2nd August 1993.

Regulation amended

2. In regulation 4(4) of the Motor Vehicles (Driving Licences) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1989(b) for the words "one year" substitute the words "5 years".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations amend regulation 4(4) of the Motor Vehicles (Driving Licences) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1989 so that, for the purposes of Article 5(1)(f) of the Road Traffic (Northern Ireland) Order 1981, the period of normal residence in Northern Ireland or, as the case may be, the United Kingdom, during which the holder of an exchangeable licence (as defined in Article 19D(1) of that Order) is eligible for the grant of a licence under Part II of that Order is five years. Formerly the period was one year.
