To be laid before Parliament under paragraph 3(3) of Schedule 1 to the Northern Ireland Act 1974

The Department of Health and Social Services, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Article 108(16) of the Betting, Gaming, Lotteries and Amusements (Northern Ireland) Order 1985(a) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:

#### Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Gaming (Variation of Monetary Limits) Order (Northern Ireland) 1993 and shall come into operation on 19th April 1993.

Maximum entitlement to prizes in gaming by means of gaming machines in certain premises

2. In Article 108(7), (8) and (9)(b) of the Betting, Gaming, Lotteries and Amusements (Northern Ireland) Order 1985 for " $\pounds 2.40$ " and " $\pounds 4.80$ " wherever they occur there shall be substituted respectively " $\pounds 3$ " and " $\pounds 6$ ".

#### **Revocation**

3. Article 2(b) of the Gaming and Lotteries (Variation of Monetary Limits) Order (Northern Ireland) 1990 is hereby revoked.

# Betting, Gaming and Lotteries EXPLANATORY NOTE

## (This note is not part of the Order.)

This Order increases the maximum entitlement to prizes in gaming by means of gaming machines in certain premises—

(a) from  $\pounds 2.40$  to  $\pounds 3$  in the case of a money prize;

(b) from  $\pounds 4.80$  to  $\pounds 6$  in the case of a non-monetary prize;

(c) from  $\pounds 4.80$  to  $\pounds 6$  in the case of a prize which must all be in money.

By virtue of Article 108(7) and (8) of the Betting, Gaming, Lotteries and Amusements (Northern Ireland) Order 1985 a prize may combine a money prize and a non-monetary prize but a prize in respect of a game played by means of a gaming machine installed on licensed premises (within the meaning of the Licensing (Northern Ireland) Order 1990) must all be in money.
