## The Social Fund (Cold Weather Payments) (General) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1994

Made 10th October 1994 Coming into operation 1st November 1994

The Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 134(2) of the Social Security Contributions and Benefits (Northern Ireland) Act 1992(a) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:

### Citation, commencement and interpretation

- 1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Social Fund (Cold Weather Payments) (General) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1994 and shall come into operation on 1st November 1994.
- (2) The Interpretation Act (Northern Ireland) 1954(b) shall apply to these regulations as it applies to a Measure of the Northern Ireland Assembly.

Amendment of regulation 3 of the Social Fund (Cold Weather Payments) (General) Regulations

2. In regulation 3 of the Social Fund (Cold Weather Payments) (General) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1988(c) (prescribed amount) for "£6" there shall be substituted "£7".

#### Revocation

3. The Social Fund (Cold Weather Payments) (General) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1991(d) are hereby revoked.

# Social Security EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations.)

These regulations further amend regulation 3 of the Social Fund (Cold Weather Payments) (General) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1988 by increasing, with effect from 1st November 1994, the prescribed amount payable in respect of each period of cold weather from £6 to £7. They contain a consequential revocation.

The regulations make in relation to Northern Ireland only provision corresponding to provision contained in regulations made by the Secretary of State for Social Security in relation to Great Britain and accordingly, by virtue of section 149(3) of, and paragraph 10 of Schedule 5 to, the Social Security Administration (Northern Ireland) Act 1992 (c. 8), are not subject to the requirement of section 149(2) of that Act for prior reference to the Social Security Advisory Committee.
