The Guaranteed Minimum Pensions Increase Order (Northern Ireland) 1994

Made 3rd March 1994 6th April 1994 Coming into operation

Whereas the Secretary of State for Social Security has made an order(a) under section 109 of the Pension Schemes Act 1993(b):

Now, therefore, the Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 105 of the Pension Schemes (Northern Ireland) Act 1993(c) and of all other powers. enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:

Citation, commencement and interpretation

- 1.—(1) This order may be cited as the Guaranteed Minimum Pensions Increase Order (Northern Ireland) 1994 and shall come into operation on 6th April 1994.
- (2) The Interpretation Act (Northern Ireland) 1954(d) shall apply to this order as it applies to a Measure of the Northern Ireland Assembly.

Increase of guaranteed minimum pensions

2. For the purposes of section 105(1) of the Pension Schemes (Northern Ireland) Act 1993 the percentage by which there is to be an increase in the rate of that part of any guaranteed minimum pension which is attributable to earnings factors for the tax year 1988-89 and subsequent tax years shall be 1.8 per cent.
