Royal Ulster Constabulary and Royal Ulster Constabulary Reserve (Full-Time) (Temporary Provisions) Regulations 1995

Made 29th March 1995

Coming into operation 30th April 1995

To be laid before Parliament

The Secretary of State, in pursuance of sections 25 and 26 of the Police Act (Northern Ireland) 1970(a), and after consulting, in accordance with section 34(2) of that Act, the Police Authority and the Police Association, and after taking into account the recommendations of the Police Negotiating Board for the United Kingdom and furnishing that Board with a draft of the regulations in accordance with section 2(1) of the Police Negotiating Board Act 1980(b), hereby makes the following regulations:—

Citation and commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Royal Ulster Constabulary and Royal Ulster Constabulary Reserve (Full-Time) (Temporary Provisions) Regulations 1995, and shall come into operation on 30th April 1995.

Meanings assigned to certain expressions

2. Until 31st December 1995, regulation 4(1) of the Royal Ulster Constabulary Regulations 1984(c) and regulation 3(1) of the Royal Ulster Constabulary Reserve (Full-Time) (Appointment and Conditions of Service) Regulations 1988(d) shall apply as if, in the definition of “public holiday”, for the words “first Monday in May” there were substituted the words “second Monday in May”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These regulations modify, for 1995 only, the application of the Royal Ulster Constabulary Regulations 1984 and the Royal Ulster Constabulary Reserve (Full-Time) (Appointment and Conditions of Service) Regulations 1988 so as to move the early May public holiday from the first Monday in May to the second Monday in May to coincide with the commemoration of the end of the second World War in Europe (V.E. Day).
