LOCAL GOVERNMENT

The Local Government (General Grant) Order (Northern Ireland) 1997

Made - - - - 16th May 1997

To be laid before Parliament under paragraph 3(3) of Schedule 1 to the Northern Ireland Act 1974

Coming into operation 2nd July 1997

The Department of the Environment, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by paragraph 3(1) of Part I of Schedule 1 to the Local Government &c. (Northern Ireland) Order 1972⁽¹⁾ and now vested in it⁽²⁾ and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Local Government (General Grant) Order (Northern Ireland) 1997 and shall come into operation on 2nd July 1997.

General Grant

2. For the purpose of paragraph 3(1) of Part I of Schedule 1 to the Local Government &c. (Northern Ireland) Order 1972 the districts specified for the year ending 31st March 1998 shall be the districts listed below:—
