

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM TO
THE PLANT HEALTH (AMENDMENT NO 3) ORDER (NORTHERN IRELAND)
2010 No. 307

Introduction

1. The Department of Agriculture and Rural Development(1), in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 2(2) 3(3) and 4 (1) (4)of the Plant Health Act (Northern Ireland) 1967(5), and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, makes the above-named Order, which is subject to negative resolution.

2. Description

2.1 This SI proposes to amend the Plant Health Order (Northern Ireland) 2006 to implement Council Directive 2007/33/EC on the control of potato cyst nematodes by introducing measures to detect and control European populations of potato cyst nematode. This Directive mainly updates testing and sampling methods, the main change is that there is to be more stringent sampling rates and regular sampling of ware potato land.

3. Matters of special interest to the Examiner of Statutory Rules

3.1 In order to avoid infraction proceedings, we anticipate breaking the 21 day rule.

4. Legislative Background

4.1 This Order amends the Plant Health Order (Northern Ireland) 2006 on the control of potato cyst nematode.

5. Consultation

5.1 A 12 week consultation was conducted in April 2008. Two organisations responded to the consultation, stating that they support the necessity to control Potato Cyst Nematode for the longer term good of the potato industry here. Both organisations supported the proposed implementation, but agreed a number of proposals regarding specific points, which will be considered by the Department in finalising implementation procedures.

6. Territorial Extent and Application

6.1 This instrument applies to Northern Ireland.

7. European Convention on Human Rights

7.1 As the instrument is subject to negative resolution procedure, no statement is required.

8. Section 24 of the Northern Ireland Act 1998

8.1 The proposed legislation has been screened for these issues and none were identified.

9. Equality Impact

9.1 These regulations will apply in equal measures to all Section 75 groups. It is not expected that any of these changes will impact differently across any of the Section 75 groups.

10. Regulatory Impact

10.1 A Regulatory Impact Assessment has not been prepared for this Statutory Rule as no direct financial impact on potato businesses, charities or voluntary bodies is anticipated. There are no equality or human rights issues.

11. Financial Implications

11.1 There are no financial implications.

12. Policy background

12.1 European Council Directive 2007/33/EC, was adopted in June 2007 and must be implemented by July 2010. It replaces the potato cyst nematode (PCN) control measures contained in Directive 69/465/EEC. The Commission has given a long implementation period due to the level of organisation and expense required to meet the enhanced sampling and testing regime. The burden will be greater on some Member States than others. Northern Ireland will not be significantly affected as our testing and sampling procedures are robust and stringent.

12.2 Potato Cyst Nematode affects potato roots, with the potential to have a detrimental affect on crop yields. Seed potato fields are sampled prior to planting and random sampling is done in ware potato crop fields to guard against an outbreak. Where it is detected in seed potato land, the control measures include scheduling (not permitting the planting of potatoes) the affected land for fifteen years.

12.3 Due to the expansion of the EU, bringing in more potato growing countries with varying levels of pest and disease numbers and types, and a general review of the provisions for controlling PCN, the previous EC Directive has been replaced by Directive 2007/33/EC. This Directive mainly updates testing and sampling methods. The main change is that there is to be more stringent

sampling rates and regular sampling of ware potato land. These measures mean that there will be increased sampling work to be done here by DARD's Quality Assurance Branch inspectors and by AFBI.

Transposition Note

This note explains how Commission Directive 2007/33/EU repealing Directive 69/465/EEC on protective measures to detect and control European populations of Potato Cyst Nematode within the Community is transposed in the Plant Health (Amendment No. 3) Order (Northern Ireland) 2010.

The Plant Health (Amendment No 3) Order (Northern Ireland) 2010 amends the Plant Health Order (Northern Ireland) 2006.

Brief description of policy / decision to be screened:-

This proposed policy consultation seeks industry views on the way forward in implementing changes to the control measures for potato cyst nematode. Due to the expansion of the EU, bringing in more potato growing countries with varying levels of pest and disease numbers and types, and a general review of the provisions for controlling PCN, the previous EC Directive has been replaced by Directive 2007/33/EC. This Directive mainly updates testing and sampling methods. The main change is that there is to be more stringent sampling rates and regular sampling of ware potato land.

Potato Cyst Nematode affects potato roots, with the potential to have a detrimental affect on crop yields. Seed potato fields are sampled prior to planting and random sampling is done in ware potato crop fields to guard against an outbreak. Where it is detected in seed potato land, the control measures include scheduling (not permitting the planting of potatoes) the affected land for fifteen years.

Aims and objectives of the policy / decision to be screened:-

To protect Northern Ireland from an increase in potato cyst nematode (PCN) in potatoes.

On whom will the policy / decision impact:-

This proposed policy will impact on the potato industry in Northern Ireland, including on potato importers bringing potatoes into Northern Ireland from Egypt (currently 13 seed merchant companies dealing in NI). It will affect the 108 seed potato growers and approximately 438 ware potato growers in Northern Ireland. There are also 30 ware merchants and 49 processors who may be affected.
