The Additional Statutory Paternity Pay (General) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2011

Made---18th July 2011Coming into operation-14th August 2011Approved by resolution of the Assembly on 5th December 2011

The Department for Employment and Learning makes the following Regulations in exercise of the power conferred by section 167ZEE(2) of the Social Security Contributions and Benefits (Northern Ireland) Act 1992(a).

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Additional Statutory Paternity Pay (General) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2011 and shall come into operation on 14th August 2011.

Amendment to the Additional Statutory Paternity Pay (General) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2010

2. In regulation 14 of the Additional Statutory Paternity Pay (General) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2010(b) (additional statutory paternity pay period (adoption)), in paragraph (1), for "before" substitute "after".
