The Department of Finance and Personnel in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 139(2) and 159(1) of the Civil Partnership Act $2004(\mathbf{a})$ hereby makes the following Regulations.

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Civil Partnership (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2014 and shall come into operation on 2 March 2015.

Amendments to the Civil Partnership Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2005

2.—(1) The Civil Partnership Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2005(**b**) shall be amended as follows.

(2) In Regulation 3(2) for "14 days" (in each place where it occurs), substitute "28 days".

(3) In Regulation 19(b) for "14 days", substitute "28 days".

(4) In Schedule 1 for "14 days", substitute "28 days".

EXPLANATORY NOTE
