#### EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM TO

### The Tyndale Gardens, Belfast (Abandonment) Order (Northern Ireland) 2019

#### S.R. 2019 No. 169

#### 1. Introduction

- 1.1. This Explanatory Memorandum has been prepared by the Department for Infrastructure to accompany the Statutory Rule (details above) which is laid before the Northern Ireland Assembly.
- 1.2. The Statutory Rule is made under Article 68(1) and (5) of the Roads (Northern Ireland) Order 1993 and is subject to the negative resolution procedure.

### 2. Purpose

- 2.1. The purpose of the rule is to abandon 26.80 square metres of road comprising two areas of footpath at Tyndale Gardens, Belfast after the completion of such works as the Department considers necessary for the provision of alternative facilities for road traffic.
- 2.2. On completion of such works as the Department considers necessary for the provision of alternative facilities and the coming into operation of the abandonment the areas of road in question shall cease to be maintainable by the Department and the public right of way over them shall be extinguished.

## 3. Background

- 3.1. The abandonment has been requested by Choice Housing Ireland Limited who are the owners of the bed and soil.
- 3.2. Following the abandonment the land in question will be incorporated into a new housing development.

### 4. Consultation

- 4.1. The PSNI has been informed and has no objection to the abandonment. Belfast City Council has been advised but no acknowledgement has been received.
- 4.2. A notice in respect of the proposed abandonment was published in the local press for two successive weeks, a notice was posted on site and the statutory undertakers were notified of the proposal. No objections were received.

### 5. Equality Impact

5.1. Consideration has been given to compliance with section 75 of the Northern Ireland Act 1998. No equality issues have been identified by the Department and no issues were raised following the publication of the notice in the press.

## 6. Regulatory Impact

6.1. A Regulatory Impact Assessment was not considered necessary as the proposal does not result in any costs or savings to business, charities or the voluntary bodies.
