The Loans for Mortgage Interest (Transaction Fee) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2020

Made----1st July 2020Laid before Parliament -2nd July 2020Coming into operation3rd August 2020

The Secretary of State in exercise of the powers conferred by Articles 3, 13 and 14(4)(b) of the Welfare Reform and Work (Northern Ireland) Order 2016(a) makes the following Regulations.

These powers are exercisable by the Secretary of State by virtue of Article 4(1)(a) of the Welfare Reform (Northern Ireland) Order 2015(b).

#### **Citation and commencement**

- 1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Loans for Mortgage Interest (Transaction Fee) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2020.
  - (2) These Regulations come into operation 3rd August 2020.

## Amendments of the Loans for Mortgage Interest Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2017

**2.** In Schedule 4 (direct payments to qualifying lenders) to the Loans for Mortgage Interest Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2017(c), omit paragraph (6) (fees payable by qualifying lenders).

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

Regulation 2 of these Regulations amends Schedule 4 to the Loans for Mortgage Interest Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2017 (S.R. 2017 No. 176) to remove the requirement for qualifying lenders to pay a fee to the Department in respect of each occasion on which a payment is made directly to the qualifying lender.
