The Planning Act 2011 (Review) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2020

Made---12th October 2020Coming into operation-2nd November 2020

The Department for Infrastructure makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by section 228(2) of the Planning Act (Northern Ireland) $2011(\mathbf{a})$ and now vested in it(**b**).

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Planning Act 2011 (Review) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2020 and shall come into operation on 2nd November 2020.

Interpretation

2. In these Regulations "the 2011 Act" means the Planning Act (Northern Ireland) 2011.

Terms of the review

3. For the purposes of section 228 of the 2011 Act, the review shall—

- (a) consider the objectives intended to be achieved by the 2011 Act;
- (b) assess the extent to which those objectives have been achieved; and
- (c) assess whether it is appropriate to retain, amend or repeal any provision of the 2011 Act or subordinate legislation made under the 2011 Act, in order to achieve those objectives.
