The Department of Health M1 , makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 25C(1), (3)(c), (4)(d) and 25F(2) of the Public Health Act (Northern Ireland) 1967 M2 .

These Regulations are made in response to the serious and imminent threat to public health which is posed by the incidence and spread of severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2) in Northern Ireland.

The Department of Health considers that the restrictions and requirements imposed by these Regulations are proportionate to what they seek to achieve, which is a public health response to that threat.

In accordance with section 25Q of that Act the Department of Health is of the opinion that, by reason of urgency, it is necessary to make these Regulations without a draft having been laid before, and approved by a resolution of, the Assembly.

Citation, commencement and interpretation

- 1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Health Protection (Coronavirus, Restrictions) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2020 and shall come into operation at 11.00 p.m. on 28th March 2020.
 - (2) In these Regulations—

[Fi"childcare" includes day care as defined in Article 19 of the Children (Northern Ireland) Order 1995;]

"coronavirus" means severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2);

[F1"elite athlete" means an individual who—

- (i) derives a living from competing in a sport,
- (ii) plays in a professional league or competition,
- (iii) is a senior representative nominated by a relevant sporting body,
- (iv) is a member of the senior training squad for a relevant sporting body, or
- (v) is aged 16 or above and on an elite development pathway.

For the purposes of the definition of "elite athlete"—

- (a) "elite development pathway" means a development pathway established by the national governing body of a sport to prepare athletes—
 - (i) so that they may derive a living from competing in that sport, or
 - (ii) to compete at that sport at the Tokyo or Beijing Olympic or Paralympic Games, or, if that sport is not part of the Tokyo Olympic and Paralympic Games programme, in the Commonwealth Games to be held in Birmingham;
- (b) "relevant sporting body" means the national governing body of a sport which may nominate athletes to represent—
 - (i) Great Britain and Northern Ireland or Ireland at the Tokyo or Beijing Olympic or Paralympic Games, or
 - (ii) England, Wales, Scotland, Northern Ireland, Gibraltar, Guernsey, Jersey or the Isle of Man at the Commonwealth Games to be held in Birmingham in those sports which are not part of the Tokyo Olympic and Paralympic Games programme;
- (c) "Senior representative" means an individual who is considered by a relevant sporting body to be a candidate to qualify to compete on behalf of—
 - (i) Great Britain and Northern Ireland or Ireland at the Tokyo or Beijing Olympic or Paralympic Games;
 - (ii) England, Wales, Scotland, Northern Ireland, Gibraltar, Guernsey, Jersey or the Isle of Man at the Commonwealth Games to be held in Birmingham in those sports which are not part of the Tokyo Olympic and Paralympic Games programme.]
 - (iii) [F2Northern Ireland at European and World Championships.]

"person responsible for carrying on a business" includes the owner, proprietor and manager of that business;

"vulnerable person" includes—

- (a) any person aged 70 or older;
- (b) any person under 70 who has an underlying health condition, including but not limited to, the conditions listed in Schedule 1;
- (c) any person who is pregnant.

The emergency period and review of need for restrictions

- 2.—(1) For the purposes of these Regulations, the "emergency period"—
 - (a) starts when these Regulations come into operation, and
 - (b) ends in relation to a restriction or requirement imposed by these Regulations on the day and at the time specified in a direction published by the Department of Health terminating the requirement or restriction.
- (2) The Department of Health must review the need for restrictions and requirements imposed by these Regulations at least once every 21 days, with the first review being carried out by 18th April 2020.
- (3) As soon as the Department of Health considers that any restrictions or requirements set out in these Regulations are no longer necessary to prevent, protect against, control or provide a public health response to the incidence or spread of infection in Northern Ireland with the coronavirus, the Department of Health must publish a direction terminating that restriction or requirement.
 - (4) A direction published under this regulation may—
 - (a) terminate any one or more requirement or restriction;
 - (b) terminate a requirement or restriction in relation to a specified business or service or a specified description or business or service.

 - (5) In this regulation, "specified" means specified in a direction published under this regulation.

Requirement to close premises and businesses during the emergency

- (2) Subject to paragraph (2A), a person responsible for carrying on a business which is listed in Part 1 of Schedule 2 must—
 - (a) during the emergency period—
 - (i) close any premises, or part of the premises, in which food or intoxicating liquor are sold for consumption on those premises, and
 - (ii) cease selling food or intoxicating liquor for consumption on its premises; or
 - (b) if the business sells food or intoxicating liquor for consumption off the premises, cease selling food or drink for consumption on its premises during the emergency period.
 - (a) (2A) (a) A person responsible for carrying on a business which is listed in Part 1 of Schedule 2 may, during the emergency period, sell [F7 intoxicating liquor, with or without food,] for consumption on those premises in the following circumstances—
 - (i) if the service takes place indoors, intoxicating liquor may only be served with food and the food must be a main table meal;
 - (ii) if the service takes place outdoors, intoxicating liquor may be served with or without food, but only to persons seated at a table and not at the bar.
 - (b) For the purposes of paragraph (a)(i), a "main table meal" means a meal which is in its entirety, or which includes, a main course and which is eaten by a person seated at—
 - (i) a table; or
 - (ii) a counter or other structure which serves the purpose of a table and which is not used wholly or mainly as a bar or for the service of refreshments for consumption by persons not seated at a table or that counter or structure.
 - (a) (3) (a) For the purposes of paragraph 2(a), food or drink sold by a hotel or other accommodation as part of room service is not to be treated as being sold for consumption on its premises.
 - (b) For the purposes of paragraph (2)(a)(ii) and (b), an area adjacent to the premises of the business where seating is made available for customers of the business (whether or not by the business) is to be treated as part of the premises of that business.]
- (4) F8... A person responsible for carrying on a business or providing a service which is listed in Part 2 of Schedule 2 must cease to carry on that business or to provide that service during the emergency period.

 - (a) premises used for the businesses or services listed in [F10 paragraphs 6 or 9] of that Part to broadcast a performance to people outside the premises, whether over the internet or as part of a radio or television broadcast;

Further restrictions and closures during the emergency period

- **4.**—[F14(1) A person responsible for providing library services must, during the emergency period—
 - (a) cease to do so, except by providing services in response to orders or enquiries received—
 - (i) through a website, or otherwise by on-line communication,
 - (ii) by telephone, including orders by text message, or
 - (iii) by post;
 - (b) close any premises which are not required to provide its services as permitted by sub-paragraph (a);

- (c) cease to admit any person to its premises who is not required to provide its services as permitted by sub-paragraph (a).
- (2) During the emergency period, a person responsible for carrying on a business listed in Part 3 of Schedule 2 may offer goods for sale or for hire in a shop, but may not provide a service listed in [F15 paragraph 13] of Part 2 of Schedule 2.]

- (5) A person who is responsible for a place of worship must ensure that, during the emergency period, the place of worship is closed, except for uses permitted in paragraph (6).
 - (6) A place of worship may be used—
 - (a) for funerals,
 - (b) to broadcast an act of worship, whether over the internet or as part of a radio or television broadcast, or
 - (c) to provide essential voluntary services or urgent public support services [F17upon the request of the Department of Health] (including the provision of food banks or other support for the homeless or vulnerable people, blood donation sessions or support in an emergency).
 - [F18(d) to solemnise a marriage or conduct a baptism]
 - [F19(e) for acts of private worship;
 - (f) to broadcast (by way of loudspeaker or radio) an act of worship to worshippers who are present in a vehicle parked on the premises, subject to the person responsible for the place of worship taking all reasonable measures to ensure that—

4A. During the emergency period, a person who is responsible for a burial ground must take all reasonable measures to ensure that a distance of at least two metres is maintained between every person at the burial ground (except between members of the same household).]

Restrictions on movement

- **5.**—(1) During the emergency period, no person may leave the place where they are living without reasonable excuse.
 - (2) For the purposes of paragraph (1), a reasonable excuse includes the need—
 - [F26(a) to obtain goods from any business listed in Part 3 of Schedule 2;]
 - (b) to take exercise either alone or with other members of their household;
 - (c) to seek medical assistance, including to access any of the services referred to in paragraph 37 or 38 of Schedule 2;
 - (d) to provide care or assistance, including relevant personal care within the meaning of paragraph 7(3B) of Schedule 2 to the Safeguarding Vulnerable Groups (Northern Ireland) Order 2007 M3, to a vulnerable person, or to provide emergency assistance;
 - (e) to donate blood
 - (f) to travel for the purposes of work or to provide voluntary or charitable services, where it is not reasonably possible for that person to work, or to provide those services, from the place where they are living;
 - [F27(g) to attend a funeral;]
- [F28(ga) to visit a burial ground to pay respects to a member of the person's household, family member or friend;]
 - (h) to fulfil a legal obligation, including attending court or satisfying bail conditions, or to participate in legal proceedings;

 - (k) in the case of a minister of religion or worship leader, to go to their place of worship;

- **6B.**—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), no person may, without a reasonable excuse, use a passenger transport service or passenger transport service premises without wearing a face covering.

Offences and penalties

- **8.**—(1) A person who—
 - (a) without reasonable excuse contravenes a requirement in [F80 regulation 3, 4, 6, 6A, 6B or 7], or
- (b) contravenes a requirement in regulation 5,

commits an offence.

- (2) A person who obstructs, without reasonable excuse, any person carrying out a function under these Regulations commits an offence.
- (3) A person who, without reasonable excuse, contravenes a direction given under [F81 regulation 6B or 7], or fails to comply with a reasonable instruction or a prohibition notice given by a relevant person under regulation 7, commits an offence.

Fixed penalty notices

- **9.**—(1) An authorised person may issue a fixed penalty notice to anyone that the authorised person reasonably believes—
 - (a) has committed an offence under these Regulations;
 - (b) $[^{F82}$ is aged 18 or over].
- (2) A fixed penalty notice is a notice offering the person to whom it is issued the opportunity of discharging any liability to conviction for the offence by payment of a fixed penalty to the [F83] authority specified in the notice].
 - [F84(2A) The authority specified in the notice must be—
 - (a) in the case of a notice issued by a person designated in accordance with paragraph (10) (ii), the district council in whose area the offence is alleged to have been committed, or

 - (a) no proceedings may be taken for the offence before the end of the period of 28 days following the date of the notice;

 - (a) give reasonably detailed particulars of the circumstances alleged to constitute the offence;
 - (b) state the period during which (because of paragraph (3)(a)) proceedings will not be taken for the offence:
 - (c) specify the amount of the fixed penalty;
 - (d) state the name and address of the person to whom the fixed penalty may be paid;
 - (e) specify permissible methods of payment;
 - (f) inform the person to whom it is given of the right to ask to be tried for the offence.
 - (5) The amount specified under paragraph (4)(c) must, subject to paragraph (6), be £60.

Effect of fixed penalty notice

- 10.—(1) This regulation applies if a fixed penalty notice is given to any person under regulation 9.



EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations require the closure of businesses selling food or drink for consumption on the premises, and businesses listed in Part 2 of Schedule 2, to protect against the risks to public health arising from coronavirus, except for limited permitted uses. Businesses offering goods for sale or for hire listed in Part 3 of Schedule 2, are permitted to remain open. The Regulations also prohibit anyone leaving the place where they live without reasonable excuse, and ban public gatherings of more than two people. The closures and restrictions last until they are terminated by a direction given by the Department of Health.

The need for these restrictions must be reviewed by the Department of Health every 21 days, with the first review taking place by 18th April 2020.

No impact assessment has been prepared for these Regulations.
