The Housing Benefit and Universal Credit (Victims of Domestic Abuse and Victims of Modern Slavery) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2022

Made - - - - *8th September 2022*

Coming into operation *1st October 2022*

The Department for Communities⁽¹⁾, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 122(1)(d), 129A(2), (3) and (4), 171(1) and (3) to (5) of the Social Security Contributions and Benefits (Northern Ireland) Act 1992⁽²⁾, and now vested in it⁽³⁾, and Articles 16(4), 48(1), (2) and (5), 101(1) and (4)(a) of the Welfare Reform (Northern Ireland) Order 2015⁽⁴⁾ makes the following Regulations. The powers are exercisable by the Department for Communities by virtue of Article 2 of the Welfare Reform (Northern Ireland) Order 2015 (Cessation of Transitory Provision) Order 2020⁽⁵⁾.
