NOW THEREFORE the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland by virtue of all the powers enabling it in that behalf hereby orders and directs as follows:—

On and from the 1st day of July, 1923, the provisions of the said Order of the Local Government Board for Ireland dated 5th July, 1901, and of the District Hospitals Order 1918 in so far as they refer to the qualifications required to be possessed by Nurses in Workhouses and by Superintendent Nurses and Matrons and by Nurses in District Hospitals shall cease to have effect, and no person shall be appointed as a Nurse in a Workhouse of any Union or as Superintendent Nurse or Matron or as a Nurse in any District Hospital in Northern Ireland unless the name of such person is entered in the general or the appropriate supplementary part of the Register of Nurses for the sick in Northern Ireland.

Returning Officers' Expenses.

REGULATIONS, DATED 23RD AUGUST, 1923, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF FINANCE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER SECTION 29 OF THE REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE ACT, 1918 (7 AND 8 GEO. 5, C. 64), IN ITS APPLICATION TO NORTHERN IRELAND, PRESCRIBING SCALE OF MAXIMUM CHARGES OF RETURNING OFFICERS AT ELECTIONS OF MEMBERS TO THE PARLIAMENT OF NORTHERN IRELAND.

1923. No. 39.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon the Ministry of Finance (hereinafter referred to as "The Ministry") by Section 29 of the Representation of the People Act, 1918, as that Act applies to Northern Ireland under the provisions of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and of any Order made by His Majesty in Council under the last-mentioned Act, the Ministry hereby prescribes that the Returning Officer shall be entitled in respect of the conduct of Parliamentary Elections (other than University Elections) of members to the Parliament of Northern Ireland to his reasonable charges not exceeding the sums hereinafter set forth, provided that the charges for disbursements are in no case to exceed the sums actually and necessarily paid or payable.

This scale will be applicable to elections conducted after the 1st day of January, 1923, subject to any alterations which may from time

to time be made.
