## INTERNED PERSONS AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS AS TO, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER THE CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1922.

## 1923. No. 48.

WHEREAS certain Regulations for Peace and Order in Northern Ireland are contained in the Schedule to the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland), 1922,\* and it is provided by Subsection (3) of Section 1 of the said Act that the Minister of Home Affairs shall have power to make Regulations (a) for making further provision for the preservation of the Peace and Maintenance of Order, and (b) for varying or revoking any provision of the Regulations, whether contained in the said Schedule, or made as aforesaid, and that any Regulations made as aforesaid shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, have effect and be enforced in like manner as Regulations contained in the said Schedule :

NOW, THEREFORE, I, THE RIGHT HONOURABLE SIR RICHARD DAWSON BATES, Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, do make the following Regulations for making further provision for the preservation of the Peace and Maintenance of Order, and the said Regulations shall be enforced and have effect in like manner as Regulations contained in the said Schedule, and the said Regulations now made and the Regulations contained in the said Schedule shall have effect and be construed as if the said Regulations now made formed part of the said Regulations in said Schedule, that is to say :--

Regulation 23 B. shall be amended as follows :----

The following new clause shall be inserted before the penultimate clause :---

"Any person interned under this regulation may, without prejudice to any other powers of removal, be removed on the Order of the Civil Authority to any place where his presence is required for the purpose of entering into a recognisance, or in the interests of justice or for the purpose of any public inquiry, and may be detained in such place for such time as his presence is so required there, and whilst being so removed or detained he shall be deemed to be interned under the provisions of this Regulation."

"This regulation shall apply to all prisoners in Northern Ireland in like manner as it applies to persons undergoing a sentence of imprisonment in Northern Ireland. For the purposes of this regulation, the expression 'prisoner' shall have the same meaning as that assigned to it in Section 11 of the Prison Act, 1898."
