MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE WITH THE CONCURRENCE OF THE LORD CHIEF JUSTICE AND THE SPEAKERS OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF COMMONS OF NORTHERN IRE-LAND IN PURSUANCE OF THE RULES PUBLICATION ACT, NORTHERN IRELAND, 1925.

The Ministry of Finance, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by Sections one and two of the Rules Publication Act (Northern Ireland), 1925 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), and with the concurrence of the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland and the Speakers of the Senate and the House of Commons of Northern Ireland as required by the Act, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1. Each of the authorities hereinafter in this Regulation specified, being authorities to which paragraph (f) of sub-section (2) of Section two of the Act applies, is hereby prescribed as a rulemaking authority for the purposes of the Act, that is to say—

The Electricity Commissioners for Northern Ireland;

The Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Northern Ireland.

2. It is hereby prescribed that statutory rules made by the National Health Insurance Joint Committee (either alone or jointly with any other rule-making authority) shall be exempted from the provisions of sub-sections (1) and (2) of Section one of the Act in cases where the statutory rules do not relate solely to Northern Ireland.

SPECIAL CONSTABULARY. Reward Fund.

MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE UNDER SUB-SECTION (5) OF SECTION 4 OF THE CONSTABULARY ACT (NORTHERN IRE-LAND), 1922.

1925. No. 64.

1. The Regulations governing the Special Constabulary Reward Fund (hereinafter referred to as "the Fund") which bear date the 17th day of October, 1922, shall be cited as "The Special Constabulary Reward Fund Regulations, 1922," and are hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Regulations."

2. The following Regulations shall be substituted for Regulations (2) and (3) respectively of the Principal Regulations--

- "(2) The Fund shall be deemed to be a public account, and, in so far as not invested in accordance with Regulation 3 hereunder, shall be kept in the books of the Belfast Banking Company in the name of the Ministry of Home Affairs.
- (3) The Ministry of Home Affairs may, with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, cause any surplus monies not required for immediate needs to be invested in trustee securities in the name of the Ministry of Home Affairs, and such investments shall form part of the Fund. The income derived therefrom shall be paid into the cash portion of the Fund and such investments may from time to time with the sanction of the Ministry of Finance be varied or realised."

3. The following additional words shall be added to Regulation (6) of the Principal Regulations :--

[&]quot; and of any gifts of cash or securities received by way of donation to the Fund."
