

Notwithstanding anything in No. 10 of the Regulations dated 31st July, 1907, (S.R. & O., 1907, No. 614), petroleum spirit may be kept for the purposes of light locomotives in iron or steel drums or barrels of a capacity not exceeding 50 gallons, provided the following conditions are observed :—

- (a) The storehouse must be situated at a distance of at least 20 feet from any other building or any highway or public footpath.
- (b) Provision must be made by excavation or by the erection of retaining walls to prevent outflow of the spirit in the event of fire if such outflow would be likely to endanger life or cause damage to the property of others.
- (c) Notice shall be given to the Local Authority, and the duly authorised officer of such Authority shall be allowed to inspect the spirit in the same manner as is provided in No. 7 of the said Regulations.

This Regulation shall come into force on 1st May, 1925, and may be revoked at any time by the said Ministry of Home Affairs.

POOR LAW. Dispensary Districts.

MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923, DETERMINING THE BOUNDARIES OF DISPENSARY DISTRICTS.

To the Council of each Administrative County in Northern Ireland :

To the Guardians of the Poor of each Poor Law Union in Northern Ireland :

To the Council of each Rural District in Northern Ireland :

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas it is enacted by sub-section 1 of Section 9 of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, that where an Order has been or is made by the Ministry of Home Affairs for

Northern Ireland (in this Order referred to as "the Ministry") (whether before or after the passing of the said Act) for altering the constitution of any district electoral division, the Ministry may, if it thinks it expedient for the purposes of the administration of the Poor Relief (Ireland) Acts, 1838 to 1914, or the Public Health (Ireland) Acts, 1878 to 1918, determine that the boundaries and contents of any dispensary district, shall, notwithstanding anything contained in section six of the Poor Relief (Ireland) Act, 1851, remain as they existed immediately before the making of the Order altering the constitution of the district electoral division, but without prejudice to the making of any subsequent Order altering the said boundaries and contents ;

And Whereas the Ministry has by various Orders, made before and after the passing of the said Act, altered the constitution of certain district electoral divisions in Northern Ireland ;

And Whereas the Ministry thinks it expedient for the purposes of the administration of the Poor Relief (Ireland) Acts, 1838 to 1914, and the Public Health (Ireland) Acts, 1878 to 1918, that the boundaries and contents of the dispensary districts in Northern Ireland should, notwithstanding anything contained in Section six of the Poor Relief (Ireland) Act, 1851, remain as they existed immediately before the making of the said Orders altering the constitution of district electoral divisions ;

Now therefore, the Ministry, in exercise of the powers vested in it by sub-section 1 of Section 9 of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, and of every power in that behalf enabling the Ministry, hereby orders and determines as follows, that is to say :—

- (1) The boundaries and contents of the dispensary districts in Northern Ireland shall, notwithstanding anything contained in section six of the Poor Relief (Ireland) Act, 1851, remain as they existed immediately before the making of the said Orders altering the constitution of district electoral divisions.
- (2) This Order may be cited as "the Dispensary Districts Order (Northern Ireland), 1925."
