

Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade.

MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR UNDER SECTION 18 OF THE
TRADE BOARDS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923 (13 & 14
GEO. 5., CH. 32).

The Ministry of Labour (in these Regulations referred to as "the Ministry"), in pursuance of powers conferred by Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, and of every other power the Ministry hereunto enabling, hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1. The Ministry may, after consultation with the Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade Board, establish a District Trade Committee for the Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade in Northern Ireland in accordance with these Regulations.

2. The jurisdiction of the District Trade Committee shall extend over Northern Ireland, exclusive of the County Boroughs of the Cities of Belfast and Londonderry, and it shall not be competent for the Committee to deal with matters other than matters affecting the area within their jurisdiction,

3. The District Trade Committee shall consist of persons appointed by the Ministry as follows :—

- (a) A Chairman, who shall be the appointed member for the time being of the Trade Board.
- (b) Six members of the Trade Board, three of whom shall represent employers and may be nominated by the representatives of employers on the Board, and three shall represent workers and may be nominated by the representatives of workers on the Board; provided that at least four of the members, two representing employers and two representing workers, shall be representatives of the trade in the area within the jurisdiction of the District Trade Committee.
- (c) Eight representatives of employers and eight representatives of workers, at least one representative of employers and one representative of workers being selected from the area in each of the six counties within the jurisdiction of the Committee.

4. The Secretary of the District Trade Committee shall be the Secretary for the time being of the Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade Board.

5. Any question as to the construction or interpretation of these Regulations shall, in the event of dispute, be referred to the Ministry for decision.

6. The Trade Boards (Northern Ireland) District Trade Committee (Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade) Regulations, dated 12th January, 1925, made by the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, are hereby revoked; provided that nothing in these Regulations shall affect the validity of any proceedings of the District Trade Committee established under the said Regulations of the 12th January, 1925.

7. These Regulations may be cited as the Trade Boards (Northern Ireland) District Trade Committee (Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade) Regulations, 1926.

Rope, Twine and Net Trade, Northern Ireland.

The Ministry of Labour (in these Regulations referred to as "the Ministry") in pursuance of powers conferred by Section 17 of the Trade Boards Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, and of every other power the Ministry hereunto enabling, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1. A Trade Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Trade Board") shall be established in Northern Ireland for the Rope, Twine and Net trade (hereinafter referred to as "the Trade") as specified in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, and as set out in the Schedule to these Regulations.

2. The Trade Board shall consist of:—

- (a) the appointed member,
- (b) not more than five members representing employers in the trade,
- (c) not more than five members representing workers in the trade, and
- (d) any additional representative members who may be appointed in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 5 of these Regulations.
