Taking or Destroying of Eggs.

Made by the Lords Justices of Northern Ireland in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1894, and the Government of Ireland Act, 1920.

1926. No. 62.

Upon application by the County Council of the County of Fermanagh, we do hereby make the following Order:—

The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is, between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of August of each year prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Fermanagh, for the space of five years from the 1st day of March, 1927:—

Buzzard, Chough, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Greenfinch, Gulls (all species), Harriers, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), Merlin, Owl (all species), Peregrine Falcon, Redshank, Raven, Sandpiper, Siskin, Skylark, Snipe, Terns (all species) Wild Duck, Woodcock.
