And whereas the award of compensation in the case of the majority of persons employed in the Civil Service of Northern Ireland is provided for by the said Workmen's Compensation Acts, and it is therefore unnecessary that the provisions of the Warrant aforesaid should apply in the case of those persons:

Now therefore, the Ministry of Finance hereby modifies the said Warrant by declaring that no award shall be made thereunder to any person, or to the widow, mother or children of any person, employed in the Civil Service of Northern Ireland who is within the definition of "workman" contained in section thirteen of the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1906, as amended by section nine of the Workmen's Compensation Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, that is to say, a person employed by way of manual labour at whatever remuneration or a person employed otherwise than by way of manual labour at a remuneration not exceeding three hundred and fifty pounds a year.
