THE PROBATION RULES (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1929.

1929. No. 105.

By His Grace The Governor of Northern Ireland.

ABERCORN.

I, JAMES ALBERT EDWARD, DUKE OF ABERCORN, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight of the Most Illustrious Order of Saint Patrick, Governor of Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the provisions of Section 7 and Section 9 of the Probation of Offenders Act, 1907, and of all other powers thereunto enabling do hereby make the following rules :---

(1) Rule 6 of the Probation Rules (Northern Ireland), 1928, is hereby repealed and the following rule substituted therefor :

6. A Probation Officer shall hold office during the pleasure of the Minister of Home Affairs and of the authority appointing him.

(2) These Rules may be cited as the Probation Rules (Northern Ireland), 1929.
