

Council to make provision for various matters under the Representation of the People Act, 1918 :

And whereas it is enacted by Section 6 of the House of Commons (Method of Voting and Redistribution of Seats) Act (Northern Ireland) 1929, (in this Order referred to as the Act of 1929), amongst other things that in the application of Sub-section (3) of Section 14 of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920 (including the enactment therein mentioned), to the university constituency constituted by the Act of 1929, the reference to His Majesty in Council shall be construed as a reference to the Governor of Northern Ireland in Council, but this provision shall not prejudice the operation of the University Elections (Single Transferable Vote) Regulations, 1918, until Regulations are made by the said Governor in Council :

And whereas it is expedient to vary the said Regulations as hereinafter mentioned in conformity with the provisions of the Representation of the People Act (Northern Ireland), 1928.

Now I, James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight of the Most Illustrious Order of St. Patrick, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice and consent of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, by virtue and in pursuance of the powers vested in Me for that purpose by the Act of 1929, and of all other powers enabling Me, do Hereby Order as follows :—

1. In the form of Voting Paper set forth in Part A. of the Second Schedule to the said Regulations the words “ (In the case of a man) ” and the words “ (In the case of a woman) that I have not voted at this general election for any other university constituency ” shall be omitted.

2. This Order may be cited as the University Elections (Single Transferable Vote) Amending Order (Northern Ireland), 1929.

## POTATOES : MARKETING OF,

---

MARKETING OF POTATOES RULES (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1929,  
DATED 25TH SEPTEMBER, 1929.

THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS FOR THIS PURPOSE VESTED IN IT BY THE MARKETING OF POTATOES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1928, AND OF EVERY OTHER POWER IN THAT BEHALF ENABLING IT, HEREBY MAKES THE RULES FOLLOWING, THAT IS TO SAY :—

### *I.—Short Title.*

These Rules shall be known as “The Marketing of Potatoes Rules (Northern Ireland), 1929.”

### *II.—Conditions to be observed by Persons granted Licences when consigning Potatoes from Northern Ireland under the authority of a Licence.*

Article IV. of the Marketing of Potatoes Rules (Northern Ireland), 1928, is hereby revoked and the following Article is substituted therefor :—

#### *Conditions to be observed by Persons granted Licences when consigning Potatoes from Northern Ireland under the authority of a Licence.*

(1) Potatoes sent by Licence-holders from Northern Ireland to Great Britain, or the Isle of Man, shall be graded, packed and of a standard of quality as laid down in the Third Schedule to these Rules and shall be accompanied by a Certificate in the form or to the effect stated in the Fourth Schedule to these Rules.

(2) The fee for inspection of a consignment of potatoes shall be at the rate of 6d. per ton of potatoes in the consignment and such fees shall be paid at such time as the Ministry may appoint.

(3) On and after the first day of November, 1929, each bag or other receptacle containing potatoes consigned from Northern Ireland under the authority of a licence must bear a label indicating the name of the person on whose premises the potatoes were bagged. This provision, however, shall not apply in the case of potatoes bagged at and consigned from any store of any licensed potato merchant.
