- 6.—(1) All certificates issued under these regulations shall be in such form as the Ministry may from time to time approve.
- (2) A copy of every certificate issued in pursuance of these regulations shall be retained in the office of the sanitary authority, and a copy shall be forwarded to the Ministry.

Expenses.

7. The owner or the master of the ship shall pay to the sanitary authority such fee for the inspection of the ship and for the issue of the certificate as the sanitary authority may with the approval of the Ministry require.

Sanitary Order relating to Urban Districts.

To the Councils of the several Urban Districts in Northern Ireland other than the Councils of County Boroughs; and to all whom it may concern:

1929. No. 19.

Whereas the Local Government Board for Ireland in exercise of the powers vested in them by Section 11 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, and of all other powers in that behalf enabling them, made an Order on the 3rd day of May, 1900, prescribing Regulations with respect to the qualification, appointment, duties, salary, and tenure of office of sanitary Officers appointed by Urban Sanitary Authorities:

And whereas by virtue of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and certain Orders made thereunder, the aforesaid powers of the Local Government Board are now vested, as respects Northern Ireland, in the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland:

And whereas it appears expedient to the said Ministry that the said Order of the 3rd day of May, 1900, should be amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers vested in it by the aforesaid statutes and of all other powers in this behalf enabling the Ministry, hereby orders and directs that the said Order of the Local Government Board for Ireland made on the 3rd day of May, 1900, shall be read and have effect as if for Article 3 thereof the following Article were substituted:—

"3. The Sanitary Authority, after consultation with the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, shall appoint so many sanitary sub-officers as the Ministry may determine, and no person shall be appointed to this Office unless with the approval of the said Ministry, and unless he possesses the sanitary Inspector's Certificate of the Royal Sanitary Institute, or an equivalent technical qualification, having regard to the duties to be carried out; provided that, in the case of an Urban Sanitary District with a population of less than 4,000 inhabitants, a person may be appointed without the qualification aforesaid if the said Ministry is satisfied that he is competent to carry out the duties of the post."
