

2. Rule 11 (Marking of Bulls) made under the said Act on 24th day of April, 1926, shall be amended to read as follows :—

11. Where any Inspecting Officer of the Ministry for that purpose duly authorised in writing by the Ministry decides to mark a bull which is regarded as up to licensing standard the mark shall consist of a right-hand or such other mark as may be registered by the Ministry and shall be tattooed on the right ear or other appropriate place. The said mark may be used in conjunction with a letter or number or both.

Where any such duly authorised officer decides to mark a bull as not being up to licensing standard, the mark shall consist of the letter " R " or such other mark as may be decided upon by the Ministry, and shall be tattooed on the right ear or other appropriate place.

3. These Rules shall come into operation as from the date hereof.

4. These Rules may be cited as the Live Stock Breeding Amendment Rules (Northern Ireland), 1929, and shall be construed as one with the Live Stock Breeding (Northern Ireland) Rules, 1926.

Application of Enactments Regulations.

1929. No. 70.

To the Council of each Administrative County in Northern Ireland :

To the Council of each Urban District in Northern Ireland ;

And to all others whom it may concern :

WHEREAS in pursuance of the provisions of the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898, and Article 26 of the Schedule to the

Local Government (Application of Enactments) Order, 1898, the Local Government Board for Ireland did, by Regulations bearing date the 25th day of July, 1899, prescribe and determine the manner of giving notices and making inquiries, and the several other matters to be prescribed and determined for the purposes of the said Article 26 :

And whereas by virtue of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and the Orders made thereunder, the functions of the said Local Government Board in regard to the aforesaid matters are now vested in the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland :

And whereas it appears expedient to the said Ministry of Home Affairs that the said Regulations of the 25th day of July, 1899, should be amended in manner hereinafter appearing.

Now, therefore, the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers vested in it by the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898, and the Local Government (Application of Enactments) Order, 1898, and of all other powers in this behalf enabling the Ministry, hereby orders and determines that the said Regulations of the 25th day of July, 1899, shall henceforth be read and have effect subject to the following amendments, that is to say :—

1. The following new Article shall be inserted immediately after Article 2 of the Regulations :

“ 2a. In any case where the Council of an Urban District make application to the County Council to make an Order for all or any of the purposes specified in subsection (1) of Article 26 of the said Schedule to the Local Government (Application of Enactments) Order, 1898, the County Council, if satisfied from such inquiries in the locality affected as they deem necessary that it is desirable to make an Order in accordance with the proposal of the Council of the Urban District, may, if they think fit, make an Order without holding a local inquiry as required by Article 1 of these Regulations.”

2. Article 5 of the Regulations shall be read and have effect as if the following paragraph were inserted at the end thereof :

“ The foregoing provisions of this Article shall apply to an Order which was made without a local inquiry being held in the same manner as they apply to an Order in respect of which a local inquiry was held.”
