In exercise of the powers conferred on me by sub-section (2) of Section 14 of the Midwives and Nursing Homes Act (Northern Ireland), 1929, I, the Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, the Minister of Home Affairs, hereby order and appoint that the provisions of Part II of the said Act shall come into operation in all Counties and County Boroughs in Northern Ireland on the first day of January, 1930.

Nursing Home Regulations.

REGULATIONS MADE IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION 9 OF THE MID-WIVES AND NURSING HOMES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1929.

1929. No. 89.

Whereas by Section 9 of the Midwives and Nursing Homes Act (Northern Ireland), 1929, it is enacted that the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as the Ministry) may make regulations with respect to :—

- (a) the records to be kept of patients received into, of miscarriages occurring in, and of children born in a nursing home, and of children born in a nursing home who are removed therefrom otherwise than into the care of any parent, guardian or relative;
- (b) the notification of any death and the cause thereof occurring in a nursing home; and
- (c) prescribing anything which under this part of the Act is to be prescribed;

Now, therefore, the Ministry in pursuance of the powers conferred upon it by the aforementioned enactment hereby orders and declares as follows :----
