## Licences: Rates of Charges.

DETERMINATION BY THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE UNDER SECTION 3 OF THE INTOXICATING LIQUOR ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923, AS AMENDED BY THE INTOXICATING LIQUOR (FINANCE) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1925, OF THE RATES AT WHICH CHARGES ARE TO BE IMPOSED IN RESPECT OF LICENCES FOR THE SALE OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR BY RETAIL TO BE GRANTED OR RENEWED DURING THE YEAR ENDING 30TH SEPTEMBER, 1931.

In pursuance of sub-sections (3) (b) and (4) of Section 3 of the Intoxicating Liquor Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, as amended by the Intoxicating Liquor (Finance) Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, the Ministry of Finance hereby determines that the rates at which charges are to be levied in respect of all licences for the sale of intoxicating liquor by retail granted or renewed during the year ending 30th September, 1931, shall be eighty per cent. of the maximum rates of charge authorised by sub-section (1) of Section 1 of the Intoxicating Liquor (Finance) Act (Northern Ireland), 1925.

# County Court Rules.

LEGITIMACY ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1928, COUNTY COURT RULES, 1930, DATED THE 28TH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1930.

#### 1930. No. 151.

Whereas by an Act, 40 and 41 Vic., C. 56, intituled "The County Officers and Courts (Ireland) Act, 1877," Section 79, it is enacted that the Lord Chancellor, with the concurrence of the County Court Judges and Chairmen of Quarter Sessions in Ireland, or any five of them, to be selected or nominated as in the said Act is provided, may make rules and orders for regulating the proceedings in and practice of the Civil Bill Courts in Ireland and for prescribing the forms of proceedings, and for the several other purposes in the said Act mentioned, and otherwise for carrying
