REGULATIONS, DATED 28TH OCTOBER, 1930, MADE BY THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE JOINT COMMITTEE AND THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR FOR NORTHERN IRELAND ACTING JOINTLY AND IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER THE WIDOWS', ORPHANS' AND OLD AGE CONTRIBUTORY PENSIONS ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1925 AND 1929.

The National Health Insurance Joint Committee and the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland acting jointly and in conjunction with the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by Section 30 of the Widows', Orphans' and Old Age Contributory Pensions Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, by Section 21 (2) (a) of the Widows', Orphans' and Old Age Contributory Pensions Act (Northern Ireland), 1929, as amended by Part I. of the Second Schedule to the National Health Insurance Act (Northern Ireland), 1930, and by the Contributory Pensions (Joint Committee) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1925 to 1930, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf hereby make the following Regulations :--

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the National Health Insurance and Contributory Pensions (Voluntary Contributors) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1930.

(2) These Regulations shall be deemed to have had effect as from 1st October, 1930.

2.—(1) In these Regulations the "Insurance Act" means the National Health Insurance Act, 1924, as amended by any subsequent enactment.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1921, applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. In calculating the period of 104 weeks for which a person must have been employed within the meaning of the Insurance Act and insured as an employed contributor in order to be entitled to become a voluntary contributor under Section 1 (3) (α) of that Act, there shall be included weeks for which contributions

were paid as an exempt person in the case of any person being a man who, having ceased to be an exempt person, became an employed contributor during the period for which, by virtue of the Contributory Pensions (Exempt Persons) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1930, he is deemed to continue to be an insured person for the purposes of the Widows', Orphans' and Old Age Contributory Pensions Acts (Northern Ireland), 1925 and 1929.
