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### Joint Committee Regulations.

REGULATIONS DATED 25TH MARCH, 1930, MADE BY THE MINISTRY  
OF LABOUR UNDER SECTION 32 OF THE WIDOWS', ORPHANS'  
AND OLD AGE CONTRIBUTORY PENSIONS ACT (NORTHERN  
IRELAND), 1925.

1930. No. 54.

The Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland in exercise of the  
powers conferred on it by Section 32 of the Widows', Orphans'  
and Old Age Contributory Pensions Act (Northern Ireland),  
1925, and with the consent of the National Health Insurance  
Joint Committee, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Contributory Pensions (Joint Committee) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1930.

2.—(1) In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

“The Act of 1929” means the Widows’, Orphans’ and Old Age Contributory Pensions Act (Northern Ireland), 1929 (20 Geo. 5, c. 17);

“The principal Act” means the Widows’, Orphans’ and Old Age Contributory Pensions Act (Northern Ireland), 1925;

“The Joint Committee” means the National Health Insurance Joint Committee;

“The Ministry” means the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1921, applies to the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3.—(1) For the purposes of the provisions of the Act of 1929 specified in the first column of the First Schedule to these Regulations, the Joint Committee alone shall exercise the powers specified in the third column of the said Schedule, and set opposite to the provisions to which they respectively relate.

(2) For the purposes of the provisions of the Act of 1929 specified in the first column of the Second Schedule to these Regulations, the Joint Committee shall exercise jointly with the Ministry the powers specified in the third column of the said Schedule and set opposite to the provisions to which they respectively relate.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

Section of Act of 1929.	Subject Matter.	Powers to be exercised by Joint Committee alone.
1 (1) proviso (iii)	Pensions of widows of men over 70 at 4th January, 1926.	Power to prescribe the modifications of the provisions of sub-section (C) of Section 1, which relates to the widows of men over 70 on 4th January, 1926, in its application in the case of a man who was an exempt person, or a person who was employed in an excepted employment.
3 (2)	Persons serving in the Navy, Army or Air Force Services, or as Masters or Seamen.	Power to make a Special Order adapting the provisions of paragraph (C) of sub-section (1) of Section 3 so as to make them applicable to any person who has served in the Navy, Army or Air Force Services or was a master or seaman, and who, if he had returned to Great Britain at the expiration of his service, would have been entitled to become a voluntary contributor.

Section of Act of 1929.	Subject Matter.	Powers to be exercised by Joint Committee alone.
3 (3) ..	Voluntary Contributors.	Power to prescribe the modifications of the provisions of sub-section (2) of Section 3 of the Insurance Act (which relates to the position of insured persons ceasing to pay contributions as voluntary contributors) in its application to persons who, having become voluntary contributors under paragraph (C) of sub-section (1) of Section 3, have subsequently ceased to pay contributions.
3 (6) ..	Persons overseas ..	Power to make regulations for the purpose of carrying Section 3 into effect, and in particular with respect to (a) the notices to be given, and (b) the information to be supplied by persons claiming privileges under this section, and with respect to (c) the intervals at which and the manner in which contributions under paragraph (c) of sub-section (1) of section 3 are to be paid.
9 (1) ..	Persons employed in excepted employment.	Power to modify the provisions of the Insurance Act relating to the continuance in insurance of persons ceasing to be employed, in their application to persons to whom sub-section (1) of Section 9 applies.
19 (2) ..	Contributions in arrear.	Power to prescribe the cases in which contributions in respect of employed persons which have not been paid on the due dates shall be treated as having been so paid for the purpose of an old age pension.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Section of Act of 1929.	Subject Matter.	Powers to be exercised by the Joint Committee jointly with the Ministry.
21 (1) ..	Voluntary contributors.	Power to prescribe (a) the conditions subject to which a person to whom Section 21 (1) refers may become a voluntary contributor; and (b) the time and the manner in which such a person may give notice to become a voluntary contributor under the Insurance Act.

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REGULATIONS, DATED 23RD SEPTEMBER, 1930, MADE BY THE  
MINISTRY OF LABOUR UNDER SECTION 32 OF THE WIDOWS',  
ORPHANS' AND OLD AGE CONTRIBUTORY PENSIONS ACT  
(NORTHERN IRELAND), 1925.

The Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland by virtue of the powers conferred on it by Section 32 of the Widows', Orphans' and Old Age Contributory Pensions Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf and with the consent of the National Health Insurance Joint Committee hereby makes the following Regulations.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Contributory Pensions (Joint Committee) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1930 (No. 2), and these Regulations and the Contributory Pensions (Joint Committee) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1925, and the Contributory Pensions (Joint Committee) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1930, may be cited together as the Contributory Pensions (Joint Committee) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1925 to 1930.

2.—(1) In these Regulations the "Joint Committee" means the National Health Insurance Joint Committee; and the "Ministry" means the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1921, applies to the interpretation.
