

6. As from the date of the framing of this Scheme there shall be deducted, with effect from the 1st May, 1929, from every payment of salary to an existing or an approved-service teacher, a contribution of one per cent. supplemental to the contribution of 4 per cent. deductible under Article 3 (1) of the Principal Scheme for a period equivalent to the period of non-contributing service reckonable for superannuation purposes in Northern Ireland, provided that such supplemental contribution shall cease on the death or retirement on pension of the teacher.

7. This Scheme shall apply to teachers who come under the terms of the Teachers' Superannuation (Reciprocal Arrangement) Scheme, 1929, and to other teachers having non-contributing service who enter or re-enter the Principal Scheme subsequent to the 1st April, 1929, only in so far as during their service in schools in Northern Ireland Article 6 hereof has been applied to them, provided that any non-contributing service of such a teacher in excess of the period for which he has paid the supplemental contribution shall be reckoned at one-third only of its actual duration.

8. Article 22 of the Principal Scheme and Article 4 of the Amending Scheme are hereby revoked.

9. This Scheme may be cited as the Teachers' (Secondary and Preparatory) Superannuation (Amendment) Scheme, 1930.

### Technical Schools and Classes : Grants.

REGULATIONS, DATED 23RD MAY, 1930, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER SECTION 77 OF THE EDUCATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923, AND LAID BEFORE PARLIAMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 99 OF THE ACT AFORESAID.

1930. No. 68.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Regulations for the Payment of Attendance Grants to Technical Schools and Classes, 1926, Amending Regulations, No. 1, 1930."

2. Regulation 2 of the Regulations for the Payment of Attendance Grants to Technical Schools and Classes, 1926 (hereinafter

called the Principal Regulations), is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following proviso :—

“ Provided that a school or class not under the control of an Education Authority must be conducted under a Scheme setting forth the constitution and defining the functions of the managers and approved by the Ministry.”

3. Regulation 9 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the omission of “ Introductory and ” in line 3 and of all the words after “ attendance ” in line 4 of the said Regulation.

4. Regulation 10 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the omission of all the words after “ character ” in line 6 of the said Regulation.

5. Regulations 14, 15 and 16 of the Principal Regulations are hereby repealed.

6. Paragraph (1) of Regulation 17 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the omission of “ examinations held at the conclusion of an Introductory Course or at ” in lines 1 and 2 of the said Paragraph.

7. Regulation 24 of the Principal Regulations is hereby repealed and the following Regulation substituted therefor :—

“ 24. One unit will be assigned in respect of the number of hours, specified hereunder, of attendance at classes recognised by the Ministry for the purpose :—

A. Instruction given in permanent centres :—

(a) during the day, i.e., prior to 6 p.m. (Saturdays 1 p.m.).

(1) in approved courses specially organized for apprentices .. .. .	50
(2) in Junior Technical Schools .. .. .	100
(3) in Day Commercial Schools .. .. .	125
(4) in approved courses of associated subjects, other than in Commerce .. .. .	75
(5) in classes, not included in categories (1)—(4) above .. .. .	200

(b) during the evening, i.e., from 6 p.m. (Saturdays 1 p.m.).

(1) in approved courses of associated subjects other than in Commerce :—	
Third and fourth year syllabuses ..	20
First and second year syllabuses ..	40
(2) in approved courses of associated subjects in Commerce :—	
Third and fourth year syllabuses ..	30
First and second year syllabuses ..	60

(3) in classes not included in categories (1) and (2) above .. .. .	100
B. Instruction given in courses conducted in non-permanent centres .. .. .	100

In assessing, under the conditions of A above, the number of units in respect of a class which meets partly during the day (i.e., prior to 6 p.m., or 1 p.m. on Saturdays) and partly during the evening (i.e., after 6 p.m., or 1 p.m. on Saturdays), attendance during the day shall be reckoned at the appropriate rate for day classes and the balance of the attendance at that for evening classes."

8. These Amending Regulations shall take and have effect as from the 1st August, 1930, and shall thenceforth be construed with and as forming part of the Principal Regulations.

### Technical Teachers.

REGULATIONS, DATED 14TH JANUARY, 1930, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER SECTIONS 65, 69 AND 77 OF THE EDUCATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923, AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND, AND LAID BEFORE PARLIAMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 99 OF THE ACT AFORESAID.

1930. No. 6.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Regulations for Technical Teachers, Northern Ireland, 1926, Amending Regulations, No. 5, 1930."

2. Regulations 25 and 26 of the Regulations for Technical Teachers, Northern Ireland, 1926 (hereinafter called the Principal Regulations), are hereby repealed and the following Regulation substituted therefor :—

" 25. When a teacher is placed or replaced on a scale of salary for technical teachers, the Ministry may, subject to Regulation 24 hereof, allow to count for the purposes of awarding increments :—

(a) his approved full-time teaching service given after the 31st July, 1923 :—
