

ORDER OF THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS, AMENDING S.R.O.
1930. No. 29 *supra*.

WHEREAS by an Order bearing date the 11th day of March, 1930, and made in pursuance of the provisions of Section 4 of the Housing Act (Northern Ireland), 1929, the Ministry of Home Affairs declared that the area described in the First Column of the Schedule thereto should be a restricted area for the purpose of the building grant as defined by Section 8 of the said Act until the said Ministry should otherwise determine.

And Whereas it is expedient that the said Order should have effect only as from the 1st day of April, 1930, and should not apply to houses completed before that date, and that said date should be fixed accordingly and that the said Order should be amended in manner hereinafter appearing :

Now, therefore, the Ministry of Home Affairs, in exercise of the powers vested in it by Section 4 of the Housing Act (Northern Ireland), 1929, and of all other powers in this behalf enabling the Ministry, hereby orders and declares that the said Order of the 11th day of March, 1930, shall have effect and shall be deemed always to have had effect as if it were therein provided that it should come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1930.

INSURANCE.

Deposits by Assurance Companies.

ORDER OF THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE DATED DECEMBER 9TH, 1930, MAKING RULES RELATING TO DEPOSITS BY ASSURANCE COMPANIES UNDER SECTION 2 OF THE ASSURANCE COMPANIES ACT, 1909 (9 EDW. 7. C. 49), AND SECTION 14 OF THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1930 (20 & 21 GEO. 5. C. 24).

Whereas by Section 14 of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland), 1930, which comes into operation on such day as the Minister of Home Affairs may appoint, it is enacted that where an Assurance Company, within the meaning of the Assurance Companies Act, 1909, carries on motor car insurance business, the Assurance Companies Act, 1909, shall apply to such business in the manner therein set forth :

And whereas the Board of Trade by Order dated the Sixth day of June, 1910, (a) made Rules relating to deposits by Assurance Companies under Section 2 of the Assurance Companies Act, 1909, which, as adapted under the provisions of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, apply in Northern Ireland, hereinafter referred to as the "Rules of 1910" :

Now therefore the Ministry of Commerce, in pursuance of the powers conferred on the Ministry by Section 2 of the Assurance Companies Act, 1909, and of every other power in that behalf it thereunto enabling, doth hereby make the following Rules in relation to deposits by Assurance Companies carrying on motor car insurance business :—

(1) The Rules of 1910 shall apply to all Assurance Companies within the meaning of the Assurance Companies Act, 1909, which carry on or intend to carry on motor car insurance business, subject to the following modifications :—

- (a) "The Act" means the Assurance Companies Act, 1909, as amended by the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland), 1930 ;
- (b) The sum of £15,000 shall be substituted for the sum of £20,000 in Rule 2 ;
- (c) In Rule 3 after the words "in any such case" shall be inserted the words "and in the case of motor car insurance business" ;
- (d) Rule 6 shall not apply to deposits in respect of motor car insurance business ;
- (e) In Rule 7 (a) (b) and (c) the words "other than motor car insurance business" shall be inserted after the words "any other class of assurance business."

(2) These Rules shall come into force on the fifteenth day of December, 1930.
