

deprived of the marks awarded to him in all the subjects of the examination, or in such subjects as the Ministry may decide ; and the Ministry may, if it thinks fit, publish his name and address as that of a student who has been so deprived.

46. The Ministry may publish such particulars of the results of the certificate examinations and such other information relating thereto as it may think fit.

47. The decision of the Ministry upon the title to certificates, exhibitions, and prizes, and upon the mode of application of exhibitions, and upon any question which may arise upon the construction of these regulations, shall be final and conclusive.

48. The Interpretation Act, 1921 (12 GEO. 5., c. 4), applies for the purpose of the interpretation of these regulations as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of the Parliament of Northern Ireland.

49. These regulations shall come into operation and have effect as from 1st August, 1931, but shall not apply to anything relating to the school-year ending 31st July, 1931.

The Regulations for the Secondary School Certificate Examinations, dated 27th May, 1929, shall continue to apply to all questions in relation to the examinations held in 1931, but for all other purposes are hereby revoked.

### Secondary Schools : Grants.

REGULATIONS, DATED THE 22ND MAY, 1931, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION, UNDER SECTION 77 OF THE EDUCATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923, AND LAID BEFORE PARLIAMENT UNDER SECTION 99 (2) OF THE ACT AFORESAID.

1931. No. 52.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Secondary School Grants Regulations, Northern Ireland, 1930, Amending Regulations, No. 1, 1931.

2. The grants payable to a school under the Secondary School Grants Regulations, Northern Ireland, 1930 (hereinafter called

“ the Principal Regulations ”), shall until further notice be subject to a reduction of three per cent. of their amount up to and including the first six hundred pounds and to a further reduction of eight per cent. of any amount thereafter.

3. Regulation 8 of the Principal Regulations is hereby repealed and the following Regulation substituted therefor:—

“ There must be enrolled at the school at least such number of pupils between the ages of 6 and 19 as the Ministry considers sufficient to warrant recognition.”

4. The following paragraph is hereby added to Regulation 31 of the Principal Regulations:—

“ (c) There must be sent to the Ministry at such dates as may be prescribed such attendance books, lists, and other information as may be required by the Ministry.”

5. Paragraph (3) of Regulation 32 of the Principal Regulations is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

“ (3) has made at least 130 attendances at the school, not more than 5 of which have been made in any one week : Provided that the Ministry may pay the grant in respect of a pupil who has made less than 130 attendances—

(i) where the pupil has been appointed by the Ministry as a senior pupil teacher in connection with a public elementary school ; and

(ii) in the case of an epidemic or other serious difficulty affecting the school as a whole.”

6. These Regulations shall take and have effect on and after 1st August, 1931, and shall thenceforth be construed with and as forming part of the Principal Regulations.

### Secondary Teachers : Regulations.

REGULATIONS, DATED 22ND MAY, 1931, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION FOR NORTHERN IRELAND, UNDER SECTIONS 65, 69 AND 77 OF THE EDUCATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923 (13 & 14 GEO. 5, CH. 21), AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE AND LAID BEFORE PARLIAMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 99 (2) OF THE ACT AFORESAID.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the “ Regulations for Secondary Teachers, 1929, Amending Regulations, No. 2, 1931.”
