

against the Regulations made in accordance with the provisions of the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland), 1922 :

Now, in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by the Regulation, the Minister of Home Affairs doth hereby order and declare as follows :—

1. From and after the date of this Order the Regulation shall, subject to the exceptions for which provision is hereinafter made, be in force throughout Northern Ireland.

2. The Regulation shall not apply to persons practising, taking part in, or being concerned in any exercise, movement, evolution, or drill of a military nature under the authority and in accordance with the conditions of a permit granted by the Inspector General, Royal Ulster Constabulary, for the time being in force, or to persons concerned in or assisting the promotion or organisation of any such exercise, movement, evolution, or drill so permitted.

3. This Order may be cited as The Military Exercise and Drill (Northern Ireland) Order, 1931.

WHEREAS certain Regulations for Peace and Order in Northern Ireland are contained in the Schedule to the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland), 1922, and it is provided by sub-section (3) of Section 1 of the said Act that the Minister of Home Affairs shall have power to make Regulations (*a*) for making further provision for the preservation of the Peace and Maintenance of Order, and (*b*) for varying or revoking any provision of the Regulations, whether contained in the said Schedule, or made as aforesaid, and that any Regulations made as aforesaid shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act have effect and be enforced in like manner as Regulations contained in the said Schedule :

Now therefore, I, The Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, do make the following Regulation for making further provision for the preservation of the Peace and Maintenance of Order, and the said Regulation shall be enforced and have effect in like manner

as Regulations contained in the said Schedule, and the said Regulation now made, and the Regulations contained in the said Schedule shall have effect and be construed as if the said Regulation now made formed part of said Regulations in said Schedule, that is to say :—

8A. The Civil Authority may make Orders prohibiting in any area the erection of any monument or other memorial if he has reason to suspect that the erection of such monument or other memorial would be of a character calculated to promote the objects of an unlawful association, or to be prejudicial to the preservation of the peace or maintenance of order.

If any such monument or other memorial has been erected, or is in process of erection, the Civil Authority may cause the same to be removed or destroyed.
