REGULATIONS, DATED THE 19TH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1932, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND FOR AMENDING THE PUBLIC HEALTH (PRESERVA-TIVES, ETC., IN FOOD) (NORTHERN IRELAND) AMENDMENT NO. 2 REGULATIONS, 1927.

The Ministry of Home Affairs in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, (a) the Public Health Act, 1896, (b) the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1896, (c) the Public Health (Regulations as to Food) Act, 1907, (d) and the Butter and Margarine Act, 1907 (e) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf with the consent of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise so far as they apply to the officers of Customs and Excise, hereby makes the following Regulations, that is to say :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Public Health (Preservatives, etc., in Food) (Northern Ireland) Amendment Regulations, 1932, and these Regulations and the Public Health (Preservatives, etc., in Food) (Northern Ireland) Regulations, 1927 (hereinafter called "the principal Regulations"), the Public Health (Preservatives, etc. in Food) (Northern Ireland) Amendment Regulations, 1927, the Public Health (Preservatives, etc., in Food) (Northern Ireland) Amendment No. 2 Regulations, 1927, the Public Health (Preservatives, etc., in Food) (Northern Ireland) Amendment No. 3 Regulations, 1927, the Public Health (Preservatives, etc., in Food) (Northern Ireland) Amendment No. 3 Regulations, 1927, the Public Health (Preservatives, etc., in Food) (Northern Ireland) Amendment Regulations, 1928, the Public Health (Preservatives, etc., in Food) (Northern Ireland) Amendment Regulations, 1929, and the Public Health (Preservatives, etc., in Food) (Northern Ireland) Amendment Regulations, 1930, the Public Health (Preservatives,

etc., in Food) (Northern Ireland) Amendment Regulations, 1931 (which seven last-named Regulations are hereinafter called "the amending Regulations") shall be construed together and may be cited together as the Public Health (Preservatives, etc., in Food) (Northern Ireland) Regulations, 1927 to 1932.

2. The principal Regulations as amended by the amending Regulations shall have effect subject to the following further amendment :---

The first day of July, 1933, shall be substituted in Article 1 of the principal Regulations for the 1st day of January, 1933, as the date on which the Regulations shall come into operation so far as they relate to cream, or any article of food containing any preservative which is necessarily introduced by the use in its preparation of preserved cream.

WHEREAS the Local Government Board for Ireland in exercise of the powers vested in them by Section 11 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, and of all other powers in that behalf enabling them made an Order on the 3rd day of May, 1900, prescribing Regulations with respect to the qualification, appointment, duties, salary and tenure of office of sanitary officers appointed by urban sanitary authorities :

And whereas by virtue of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and certain Orders made thereunder, the aforesaid powers of the Local Government Board are now vested, as respects Northern Ireland, in the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland.
