

Subsidiary Employments.

SPECIAL ORDER DATED 24TH DECEMBER, 1931, MADE BY THE
MINISTRY OF LABOUR FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER THE
UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT, 1920 (10 & 11 G. 5, c. 30).

The Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry"), by virtue of the powers conferred by paragraph (j) of Part II of the First Schedule to, and Section 4 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, and of all other powers in that behalf, with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, hereby makes the following Special Order :

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Subsidiary Employments) Order (Northern Ireland), 1931, and shall have effect as from the fourth day of January, 1932.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1921, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. The Unemployment Insurance (Subsidiary Employments) Consolidated Order (Northern Ireland), 1925, (S.R. & O. of N.I. 1925, No. 71) is hereby revoked but without prejudice to any right, privilege, obligation or liability acquired, accrued or incurred thereunder.

3. The National Health Insurance (Subsidiary Employments) Order (Northern Ireland), 1931, being a Special Order made under the National Health Insurance Acts (Northern Ireland), 1924 to 1931, in Article 1 of and the First Schedule to which certain classes of employment are specified as being of such a nature that they are ordinarily adopted as subsidiary employments only and not as the principal means of livelihood, is hereby declared by the Ministry to apply for the purposes of the Unemployment Insurance Acts (Northern Ireland), 1920 to 1931.

4. Persons engaged in the several classes of employment specified in the Second Schedule to the National Health Insurance (Subsidiary Employments) Order (Northern Ireland), 1931, under the conditions therein mentioned shall, with the following exceptions, be included amongst the persons employed within the meaning of the Unemployment Insurance Acts (Northern Ireland), 1920 to 1931.

- (a) Any persons employed in or about a cathedral, church, or other place of religious worship as a beadle, sacristan or verger, sexton, chapel-keeper, church officer, pew opener or doorkeeper, who is ordinarily required to render 24 or more hours' personal service weekly,

This Order having lain before both Houses of Parliament for 10 days in accordance with section 4 (1) of the Rules Publication Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, duly came into force.

otherwise than on Sunday or the Sabbath, in any one or more of the employments specified in Part I of the First Schedule hereto.

- (b) Any person employed as a milker, that is to say, engaged in milking, where the person so employed is otherwise ordinarily employed by the authority, company or other body or person to whom the service is rendered.
- (c) Any person employed in the harvesting or gathering of flowers, fruit, peas or potatoes, or in the tying, training or picking of hops, or in the peeling of onions, who was at the time of entering on the employment an insured person.
- (d) Any person in attendance upon old age pensioners or persons in receipt of outdoor relief, where the person so employed is otherwise ordinarily engaged in the service of the same employer.
- (e) Any person employed as a game watcher or shore watcher where the employment in one or more such capacities under one employer involves whole-time service.
